## INFORMATIONAL MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: Presentation from Thorntons (Video Gaming & Potential Change of Class

**Liquor License**)

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Attached please find information regarding a proposed Video Gaming Café at Thorntons, a gas station and convenient mart located at the intersection of Algonquin Road and Crystal Lake Road. The ultimate intention of Thorntons is to remodel to include an age-restricted gaming room for the installation and operation of video gaming terminals. Thorntons has approached the Village's Liquor Commissioner requesting consideration for a liquor license, which would allow for the sale and consumption of beer on premises. Such a license would allow for Thorntons to meet the Illinois Video Gaming Board requirements to apply for a gaming license through the State; Thorntons does not qualify as a Truck Stop.

The Village Board denied a similar request on April 26, 2018 when Speedway, LLC requested licensing for on-premise beer and wine consumption with the same interest in offering gaming opportunities to its patrons. Lake in the Hills has nine gas stations, none of which currently hold liquor licenses that allow for on-site consumption. The Grove Mart meets state regulations to be designated a truck stop and, as such, has video gaming terminals under separate provisions.

A representative from Thornton's will be in attendance at the January 8, 2019 Committee of the Whole meeting and intends to present a business case as well as review the planned regulations surrounding the service of alcohol on premise.



Bring the Thorntons brand identity established by the exterior architecture into the retail floor – "bring the outside in"





- Use colors to draw attention to room with or without illuminated signs

# Thorntons Liquor Policy



#### ON PREMISES LIQUOR MANAGEMENT POLICY & PROCEEDURES OVERVIEW:

- 1) Consumption of beverages from the retail cooler will be prohibited only designated single-serve beer may be consumed on-site.
- 2) Guests may only purchase beer for on-site consumption from designated singles cans kept in a locked mini-fridge in the cash-wrap area.
- 3) Guests may consume beer ONLY in the gaming area.
- 4) The price for single-serve beer is \$6 each.
- 5) 2 drinks per day maximum per guest.
- 6) Anyone in violation of Thorntons' policy will be asked to immediately comply or leave guest's failure to follow instructions will result in Thorntons call to Police.
- 7) All Team Members will have a current BASSET certificate.
- 8) Signage: Discuss low profile approach or high identity signage approach including topics of game room only, beer price, limited quantity.
- 9) Technology: Game room camera with wide field of view installed by Tap Room Gaming. Monitor giving visual coverage to all occupants.
- 10)If determined to be desirable, monitors displaying camera's image will be installed on articulating monitor stands visible to all POS positions.



#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Attached please find an Ordinance amending Chapter 33, Section 33.08B of the Municipal Code providing for an additional Class A-2 Liquor License for Gingers LITH LLC d/b/a Ginger's. A Class A-2 license allows for the retail sale, in cafes', as defined in Appendix A of this Code, of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises where sold, provided that there be no exterior signs or interior signs visible from the exterior of the premises advertising or advising of the sale or presence of alcoholic liquor or video gaming. The current businesses that have a Class A-2 license are: Dotty's and Stella's.

The Village Board verbally provided support of Ginger's business concept at the Committee of the Whole meeting on November 6, 2018.

A representative from Gingers LITH LLC will be present at the January 8th Committee of the Whole meeting.

#### ORDINANCE 2019 - \_\_\_\_

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 33, Liquor Control and Liquor Licensing, Section 33.08B "Number of Licenses Issued" of the Lake in the Hills Municipal Code

WHEREAS, the Village of Lake in the Hills, McHenry County, Illinois, is a home rule municipality as contemplated under Article VII, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and the passage of this Ordinance constitutes an exercise of the Village's home rule powers and functions as granted in the Constitution of the State of Illinois.

WHEREAS, the Village of Lake in the Hills has reviewed and assessed the costs of administering video gaming licensing, police involvement in monitoring and responding to establishments related to video gaming, code enforcement inspections and other related costs specifically attributable to video gaming in adjusting the fee structure for video gaming licenses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake in the Hills, McHenry County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That Section 33.08B "Number of Licenses issued" of the Lake in the Hills Municipal Code shall be amended to read as follows:

# 33.08 CLASSIFICATIONS, FEES, AND DAILY AND EVENT PERMITS, AND AUXILIARY LICENSES

B. NUMBER OF LICENSES ISSUED: There shall be in the Village not more than:

SUBJECT: Purchase Kronos Workforce Ready Software

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Village transitioned to Kronos for timekeeping and attendance in 2012. At the time, this transition included extensive research and ultimately a lengthy and time consuming implementation in order to bring Kronos into our network environment, which included installing new servers on premises to run Kronos. Kronos has been in need of an upgrade since 2016, but has been postponed until now due to the cost of the upgrade.

The original plan was to upgrade Kronos with the same "Workforce Central" system, which requires Village owned servers on premise. However, after further conversations with our Kronos representative, there was another option to upgrade our timekeeping solution to the Kronos "Workforce Ready" system, which is a cloud based solution at a reduced cost.

Moving our timekeeping software to the cloud has a number of benefits. Among the biggest benefit to our organization is that we will no longer be responsible for costly server upgrades to keep up with the newest versions of Kronos and Java, which is required to run Kronos. Furthermore a cloud solution is in line with the MIS vision of leaner, more agile information systems by reducing the amount of physical devices that rely on our network.

Staff researched another timekeeping and attendance solution called ExecuTime, which is provided through New World/Tyler Technologies. This was an attractive option as it would have integrated well with our financial system through New World. However, after our due diligence, it was determined that ExecuTime is a relatively newer solution and not as complete of a product that Kronos offers. ExecuTime was also significantly more costly than Kronos.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The FY19 budget includes \$55,000 for the upgrade of our Timekeeping Software, which includes both Kronos and Telestaff. Telestaff is used solely by the Police Department and will be purchased later in the year. The cost for the Kronos "Workforce Ready" solution is \$20,864.25 and will result in a budget savings from the Kronos "Workforce Central' solution that was budgeted.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Village has been using Laserfiche since 2005 as our digital document retention solution. Since that time the Village has not upgraded or made any improvements to this system, except for adding additional user licenses in 2018. As would be expected with 14 year old software, it has its limitations and is no longer able to keep up with current digital document retention demands. Our version of Laserfiche is so antiquated we are among the last remaining organizations supported by TKB Associates, Inc. that still operate on this version. Laserfiche is not an off the shelf software product and can only be purchased through certified resellers. TKB Associates Inc. is the number one Laserfiche reseller in Illinois, which the Village has worked with since our original implementation of Laserfiche in 2005.

The Laserfiche Avante upgrade offers several benefits to our organization including expanding the number of administrative user licenses available to staff. This upgrade comes with numerous features previously unavailable, such as a web portal for our end users to quickly search for documents. This web portal will eventually become a public facing resource as a way to better serve residents. This upgrade is in line with the Village's strategic plan initiative of operational excellence.

## FINANCIAL IMPACT

The FY19 budget includes \$40,000 for the Laserfiche Avante upgrade. The cost provided by TKB Associates, Inc. is \$31,858.00. Staff confirmed with TKB Associates, Inc. that this quote was still valid as of January 3, 2019.

SUBJECT: Purchase of two Ford Utility Interceptor Police Squads

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The police department budgeted to replace four patrol squad cars based on the vehicles reaching the end of their useful service life this budget cycle. The vehicles scheduled for replacement are:

- 2014 Chevrolet Tahoe with 110,437 miles and 22,165 engine idle hours
- 2014 Chevrolet Tahoe with 107,216 miles and 13,165 engine idle hours
- 2012 Chevrolet Tahoe with 149,826 miles; not equipped with an engine idle hour meter
- 2012 Chevrolet Tahoe with 125,841 miles; not equipped with an engine idle hour meter

The Suburban Purchasing Cooperative does not have an active contract for the 2019 Ford Utility Interceptor due to a fast changeover to the redesigned 2020 model. Currie Motors has two 2019 Ford Utility Interceptors in stock available for immediate delivery that the department can purchase under the cost of a similar equipped 2020 model. The new base price of the 2020 model without options is \$31,994 with estimated delivery dates in September. The total amount per vehicle quoted with options for the 2019 model is \$28,675. The 2020 model with similar equipment to the 2019 models will cost about \$32,858.

The department typically purchases vehicles using the joint purchasing programs from the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative or Illinois State Police but can save a substantial amount of money buying these two vehicles without using a joint purchasing program. The purchase of the remaining vehicles, a Dodge Charger, and a pickup truck, will utilize a joint purchasing agreement.

## FINANCIAL IMPACT

The 2019 General Fund Capital Budget includes \$ 125,520 for the purchase of four squads. The total cost for the two Ford Explorers is \$57,350. Two other vehicles will be purchased on a later date.

A skid steer has proven to be a necessary piece of equipment for the Public Works Department over the last 20 years and public works staff believe that a John Deere skid steer best fits the needs of the department. West Side Tractor Sales is the sole John Deere dealership for this region and they provided the Village with a quote for a new John Deere skid street at a cost of \$97,825.00. Staff then checked the cost of the unit through a number of purchasing cooperatives, including US Communities, General Services Administration, National Cooperative Purchasing Alliance, the Sourcewell Cooperative, the Cooperative Purchasing Network, and the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative. The Sourcewell Cooperative offers the lowest price contract for the John Deere skid steer at \$85,781.53, which includes an asphalt sweeper broom box, a hydraulic breaker, a grapple bucket and pallet forks. This is \$12,043.47 below the West Side Tractor quote and \$12,218.47 under the budgeted amount.

This purchase is exempt from the normal bidding process by Section 9.13 of the Village's Municipal Code due to the use of the purchasing cooperative. The John Deere skid steer specifications from the Sourcewell Cooperative are attached for your review and consideration.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Village's 2019 capital budget includes \$ 98,000.00 for the purchase of the skid steer, and the total cost is \$85,781.53, which is \$12,218.47 under budget.





The 2019 budget includes \$25,000.00 for the replacement of unit 78, an SUV used by the Public Works Administration Division, \$35,000.00 for the replacement of unit 172, a van used by the Public Works Public Properties Division and \$38,000.00 for the replacement of unit 75, a pick-up truck used by the Public Works Water Division. Village staff researched different vehicle makes and models and determined that purchasing a Ford Escape, a Ford Transit and a Ford F-250 as replacement vehicles for units 78, 172 and 75 would provide the most value to the Village. After identifying the specifications for all three vehicles, Village staff compared the final cost of each of these vehicles through a local Ford dealership and a number of purchasing cooperatives, which are aggregated joint purchasing programs that receive competitive bid prices for vehicles for governmental purchase. Staff determined that the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative's joint bids for these Ford vehicle models, awarded to Currie Motors of Frankfort, IL, offers the lowest pricing for all three vehicles. The total cost for all three vehicles is \$92,096.00, which is \$5,904.00 under the budgeted amount of \$98,000.00

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The 2019 budget includes \$49,000.00 for the replacement of unit 66, a pick-up truck used by the Public Works Water Division and \$49,000.00 for the replacement of unit 81, a pick-up truck used by the Public Works Streets Division. Village staff researched several pick-up truck brands and determined the Ford F-350 model pick-up truck would provide the most value to the Village. After identifying the specifications for both pick-up trucks, Village staff compared the final cost of the trucks through a local Ford dealership and a number of purchasing cooperatives, which are aggregated joint purchasing programs that receive competitive bid prices for vehicles for governmental purchase. Staff determined that the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative joint bid for Ford F-350 pick-up trucks, awarded to Roesch Ford of Bensenville, IL, offers the lowest pricing for the pick-up trucks that Village staff desire to purchase. The total cost for both pick-up trucks is \$96,811.00, which is \$1,189.00 under the budgeted amount of \$98,000.00

This purchase is exempt from the normal bidding process by Section 9.13 of the Village's Municipal Code. The pick-up truck specifications are attached for your review and consideration.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Village's 2019 Capital Budget includes \$98,000.00 for the purchase of these two pickup trucks, and the total cost is \$96,811.00, which is \$1,189.00 under budget.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

In 2018, the Village issued an RFP for grounds maintenance services at various locations throughout the Village. The RFP requested pricing for services in 2018 as well as 2019 and 2020. On February 22, 2018, the Village Board awarded a grounds maintenance services contract to Ryco Landscaping of Lake in the Hills, IL, through December 31st of 2018. At the start of the 2018 contract, Ryco Landscaping had difficulty meeting the service levels prescribed in the contract; however, Ryco Landscaping improved their performance as the year progressed and overall, Village staff have been satisfied with the services that Ryco Landscaping performed in 2018. As such, Village staff recommend awarding a one-year contract extension to Ryco Landscaping through December 31, 2019. The 2019 contract award amount of \$432,681.00 represents a zero percent increase from 2018.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Village's 2019 budget includes \$432,681.00 (\$66,918.00 in the General Fund, \$12,582.00 in the Water Fund, \$189,652.00 in the Special Service Areas Fund, and \$163,529.00 in the Parks and Recreation Fund) for this contract. The total expense for 2019 is \$432,681.00.

SUBJECT: 2019 Pavement Rejuvenator Contract Extension

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Village relies on Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) revenue from the State of Illinois as the primary funding source for pavement replacement projects and over the years, MFT revenues have gradually declined. This decline in MFT revenue along with consistent annual pavement replacement project cost increases have challenged Village staff to investigate new ways of prolonging pavement lifecycles, one of which is pavement rejuvenator products. These products are usually petroleum based and if applied to one-year old pavement, are expected to penetrate and rejuvenate the pavement surface to prolong the life of the pavement.

In recent years, Village staff received positive reviews from surrounding municipalities concerning Corrective Asphalt Materials (CAM) brand pavement rejuvenator product. As a result, the Village is in the third year of a five-year pilot program to determine whether there are positive benefits in utilizing CAM's product to help prolong the lifecycle of its pavement. After the pilot program term, Village staff will determine whether the product has delayed the pavement failure and decide whether to continue to use the product.

The Village, along with other surrounding municipalities, joined with the McHenry County Municipal Partnering Initiative (MPI) in their 2017 Pavement Rejuvenator Joint Contract Proposal. CAM, as the sole bidder of this product in Illinois, was awarded the MPI contract, and in their proposal, provided pricing for 2017, 2018 and 2019. The 2019 cost for CAM's product is \$0.84 per square yard and includes sweeping, cleanup, traffic control and resident notification.

In 2019, Village staff plan to apply CAM's product to 100% of all resurfaced roadways from the previous year. As such, if the contract extension is approved by the Village Board, all 64,285 square yards of pavement resurfaced in 2018 will receive the CAM product in 2019. The 64,285 square yards include sections of pavement on the following roads: Old Pyott Road, Spencer Place, Lakewood Road, Hillsboro Lane, Waterford Lane, Crossview Court, Haddon Court, Winslow Way, Bordeaux Drive, Prides Run, Briarfield Lane, Ferryville Drive, Chadwick Lane, Starwood Pass, Grafton Farm Drive, Marie Avenue, Ellis Road, Noelle Bend, Sullivan Pass, Brisbane Drive, Banbury Lane and Woody Way.

# ARTICLE I THE SERVICES

  - ii. Inspection of improvements; and
  - iii. Performance of these duties in a manner which protects the Village's interests and keeps costs under control to maintain the Village's competitive position relative to other municipalities in the area.
- 2. <u>Task Orders</u>. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall, at its sole cost and expense, provide, perform, and complete all of the following, all of which is herein referred to as the "Services", subject to reimbursement of costs as described in the Task Order and this contract:

All Task Orders issued pursuant to this Contract shall be in the general form attached hereto as Attachment B, and all Services to be provided pursuant to any such Task Order shall be provided, performed, and completed in accordance with the terms and conditions contained in such Task Order and this Contract Consultant and Owner shall agree on the scope of Services to be provided, the time for performance of the Services to be provided, and the cost or, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases with separate costs, the costs for each separate phase of Services to be provided under each Task Order. No Services shall be provided under this Contract without the issuance of a Task Order approved by Owner and Consultant.

The terms and conditions set forth in this Contract shall apply to each Task Order unless specifically modified in such Task Order. In the event of a conflict between this Contract and a Task Order, the conflicting provision of the Task Order shall take precedence for that Task Order. In the event this Contract is amended by Owner and Consultant, such amendment shall apply to all Tasks Orders issued after the effective date of the amendment and, unless otherwise specifically provided in such amendment, shall not apply to any Task Orders issued prior to the effective date of the amendment.

No Task Order shall be issued pursuant to this Contract after December 31, 2019, unless such date is extended by amendment to this Contract. Owner reserves the right to employ other engineers on its projects and shall not be obligated to issue any Task Orders pursuant to this Contract.

# 1.2 Commencement and Completion Dates

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall commence the Services not later than the "Commencement Date" set forth in the Task Order for such Project, and shall diligently and continuously prosecute the Services at such a rate as will allow the Services to be fully provided, performed, and completed in full compliance with the Task Order for such Project and this Contract not later than the "Completion Date" or, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases with separate completion dates, the "Completion Dates" set forth in the Task

Order for such Project, as such Completion Date or Dates may be extended by a Change Order issued pursuant to Section 2.1 of this Contract due to changes in the Task Order, the Project, or the Services, or due to delays that result from causes that could not be avoided or controlled by Consultant in accordance with Article II of this Contract. The time of commencement, rate of progress, and time of completion for each Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract are referred to in this Contract as the "Contract Time."

# 1.3 Required Submittals

- A. <u>Submittals Required</u>. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall submit to Owner all reports, documents, data, and information specifically set forth in the Task Order for such Project or otherwise required to be submitted by Consultant under this Contract and shall, in addition, submit to Owner all such reports, documents, data, and information as may be requested by Owner to fully document the Services for such Project ("Required Submittals"). In the event Owner requests Consultant to submit any such report, document, data, or information to fully document the Services that are not specifically set forth in the Task Order for such Project or otherwise required to be submitted by Consultant under this Contract, then an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price for such Task Order may be made in accordance with Section 2.1 of this Contract.
- Time of Submission and Owner's Review. For each Project delineated В. and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, all Required Submittals shall be provided to Owner no later than the time, if any, specified in the Task Order for such Project or otherwise in this Contract. If no time for submission is specified for any Required Submittal, such Submittal shall be submitted within a reasonable time in light of its purpose and, in all events, in sufficient time, but not more than 30 days in advance, to permit Owner to review the same prior to the commencement of any part of the Services to which such Required Submittal may relate. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner shall have the right to require such corrections as may be necessary to make any Required Submittal conform to the Task Order for such Project and this Contract. No Services related to any Required Submittal shall be performed by Consultant until Owner has completed review of such Required Submittal with no exception noted. Owner's review and stamping of any Required Submittal shall not relieve Consultant of the entire responsibility for the performance of the Services in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to the Task Order for such Project and this Contract, and shall not be regarded as any assumption of risk or liability by Owner.
- C. <u>Responsibility for Delay</u>. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall be responsible for any delay in the Services due to delay in providing Required Submittals

conforming to the Task Order for such Project and this Contract that could have been avoided or controlled by Consultant.

# 1.4 Review and Incorporation of Contract Provisions

Consultant represents and warrants that it has carefully reviewed, and fully understood, this Contract, including all of its Attachments, and, by its approval of each Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, that it has carefully reviewed, and fully understood, each such Task Order, all of which are by this reference incorporated into and made a part of this Contract.

# 1.5 Financial and Technical Ability to Perform

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant represents and warrants, by its approval of such Task Order, that it is financially solvent, and has the financial resources necessary, and that it is sufficiently experienced and competent, and has the necessary capital, facilities, plant, organization, and staff necessary, to provide, perform, and complete the Services in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract.

### 1.6 Time

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant represents and warrants, by its approval of such Task Order, that it is ready, willing, able, and prepared to begin the Services on the Commencement Date set forth in the Task Order for such Project and that the Contract Time for such Task Order is sufficient time to permit completion of the Services in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract for the Contract Price set forth in the Task Order for such Project.

# 1.7 Consultant's Personnel and Subcontractors

A. <u>Consultant's Personnel</u>. For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall provide all personnel necessary to complete the Services, including without limitation the "Key Project Personnel" identified in the Task Order for such Project. Consultant shall provide to Owner telephone numbers at which the Key Project Personnel for such Task Order can be reached on a 24 hour basis. Consultant and Owner may by mutual written agreement make changes and additions to the designations of Key Project Personnel in such Task Order. Consultant shall notify Owner as soon as practicable prior to terminating the employment of any such designated Key Project Personnel, or reassigning any of such designated Key Project Personnel to other positions, or upon receiving notification of the resignation of any of such designated Key Project Personnel. Consultant shall submit justification, including a description of proposed

substitute personnel, in sufficient detail to permit evaluation by Owner of the impact of the proposed action on the Services to be provided, performed, and completed under such Task Order. No such termination or reassignment shall be made by Consultant without prior written approval of Owner. Consultant shall have no claim for damages, for compensation in excess of the Contract Price for such Task Order, or for a delay or extension of the Contract Time for such Task Order as a result of any such termination, reassignment, resignation, or substitution.

- В. Approval and Use of Subcontractors. For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall perform the Services with its own personnel and under the management, supervision, and control of its own organization unless otherwise approved by Owner in writing. All subcontractors and subcontracts used by Consultant shall be acceptable to, and approved in advance by, Owner. Owner's approval of any subcontractor or subcontract shall not relieve Consultant of full responsibility and liability for the provision, performance, and completion of the Services in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract. All Services performed under any subcontract shall be subject to all of the provisions of the Task Order for such Project and this Contract in the same manner as if performed by employees of Consultant. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, every reference in the Task Order for such Project and in this Contract to "Consultant" shall be deemed also to refer to all subcontractors of Consultant, and every subcontract shall include a provision binding the subcontractor to all provisions of the Task Order for such Project and this Contract.
- C. Removal of Personnel and Subcontractors. For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, if any personnel or subcontractor fails to perform the part of the Services undertaken by it in a manner satisfactory to Owner, Consultant shall immediately upon notice from Owner remove and replace such personnel or subcontractor. Consultant shall have no claim for damages, for compensation in excess of the Contract Price for such Task Order, or for a delay or extension of the Contract Time for such Task Order as a result of any such removal or replacement.

# 1.8 Owner's Responsibilities

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner shall, at its sole cost and expense and except as otherwise provided in the Task Order for such Project: (a) designate in writing a person with authority to act as Owner's representative and on Owner's behalf with respect to the Services except those matters that may require Board approval

of Owner; (b) provide to Consultant all criteria and full information as to Owner's requirements for the Project or work to which the Services relate, including Owner's objectives and constraints, schedule, space, capacity and performance requirements, and budgetary limitations relevant to the Project; (c) provide to Consultant all existing studies, reports, and other available data relevant to the Project; (d) arrange for access to and make all provisions for Consultant to enter upon public and private property as reasonably required for Consultant to perform the Services; (e) provide surveys describing physical characteristics, legal limitations, and utility locations for the Project and the services of geotechnical engineers or other consultants when such services are reasonably requested by the Consultant, are necessary for the performance of the Services, and are not already provided for in the Task Order for the Project; (f) provide structural, mechanical, chemical, air and water pollution tests, test for hazardous materials, and other laboratory and environmental tests, inspections, and reports required by law to be provided by Owner in connection with the Project; (g) distribute to all applicable departments within Owner's organization for review and comment, and review and comment on, all Required Submittals and other reports, documents, data, and information presented by Consultant; (h) except as otherwise provided in the Task Order for the Project, provide approvals from all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project when such services are reasonably requested by the Consultant, are necessary for the performance of the Services, and are not already provided for in the Task Order for the Project; (i) except as provided in Article IV of this Contract, provide all accounting, insurance, and legal counseling services as may be necessary from time to time in the sole judgment of Owner to protect Owner's interests with respect to the Project; (j) attend Project related meetings; and (k) give prompt written notice to Consultant whenever Owner observes or otherwise becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or timing of the Services, provided, however, that failure to give such notice shall not relieve Consultant of any of its responsibilities under the Task Order for the Project or this Contract.

# 1.9 Owner's Right to Terminate or Suspend Services for Convenience

- A. <u>Termination or Suspension for Convenience</u>. Owner shall have the right, for its convenience, to terminate or suspend the Services under any Task Order in whole or in part at any time by written notice to Consultant. Every such notice shall state the extent and effective date of such termination or suspension. On such effective date, Consultant shall, as and to the extent directed, stop Services under such Task Order, cease all placement of further orders or subcontracts under such Task Order, terminate or suspend Services under existing orders and subcontracts for such Task Order, and cancel any outstanding orders or subcontracts under such Task Order that may be canceled.
- B. <u>Payment for Completed Services</u>. In the event of any termination pursuant to Subsection 1.9A above, Owner shall pay Consultant

(1) Consultant's Direct Labor Costs and Reimbursable Expenses, as defined in the Task Order for such Project, for all Services done in compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract up to the effective date of termination; and (2) such other costs pertaining to the Services, exclusive of overhead and profit, as Consultant may have reasonably and necessarily incurred as the result of such termination. Any such payment shall be offset by any prior payment or payments under such Task Order and shall be subject to Owner's rights to withhold and deduct as provided in this Contract.

## ARTICLE II CHANGES AND DELAYS

## 2.1 Changes

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner shall have the right, by written order executed by Owner, to make changes in the Task Order, the Project, the Services and the Contract Time ("Change Order"). If any Change Order causes an increase or decrease in the amount of the Services, an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price or Contract Time for such Task Order may be made. No decrease in the amount of the Services caused by any Change Order shall entitle Consultant to make any claim for damages, anticipated profits, or other compensation.

## 2.2 Delays

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall, upon timely written application, be entitled to issuance of a Change Order providing for an extension of the Contract Time for such Task Order for a period of time equal to the delay resulting from causes that could not be avoided or controlled by Consultant. No extension of the Contract Time for such Task Order shall be allowed for any other delay in completion of the Services.

## 2.3 No Constructive Change Orders

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, no claims for equitable adjustments in the Contract Price or Contract Time for such Task Order shall be made or allowed unless embodied in a Change Order. If Owner fails to issue a Change Order for such Task Order including, or fully including, an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price or Contract Time to which Consultant claims it is entitled, or, if Consultant believes that any requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision of Owner entitles Consultant to an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price or Contract Time that has not been included, or fully included, in a Change Order for such Task Order, then Consultant shall

submit to Owner a written request for the issuance of, or revision of, a Change Order for such Task Order, including the equitable adjustment, or the additional equitable adjustment, in the Contract Price or Contract Time that Consultant claims has not been included, or fully included, in a Change Order for such Task Order. Such request shall be submitted before Consultant proceeds with any Services for which Consultant claims an equitable adjustment is due and shall, in all events, be submitted no later than two business days after receipt of such Change Order or receipt of notice of such requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision. Notwithstanding the submission of any such request, Consultant shall, unless otherwise directed by Owner within two business days after receipt by Owner of such request, proceed without delay to perform the Services in compliance with the Change Order or as required, directed, instructed, interpreted, or decided by Owner and shall, pending a final resolution of the issue, keep a daily record of such Services. Unless Consultant submits such a request within two business days after receipt of such Change Order or receipt of notice of such requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision, Consultant shall be conclusively deemed (1) to have agreed that such Change Order, requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision does not entitle Consultant to an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price or Contract Time for such Task Order and (2) to have waived all claims such Change Order, requirement, direction, interpretation, determination, or decision.

# ARTICLE III CONSULTANT'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR DEFECTIVE SERVICES

#### 3.1 Representation of Services

A. Scope of Representation. For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall put forth reasonable professional efforts to comply with applicable laws, codes, and regulations in effect as of the date of this agreement. Design changes made necessary by newly enacted laws, codes, and regulations after this date shall entitle the consultant to request a reasonable adjustment in the schedule and additional compensation in accordance with the Additional Services Provisions of this Agreement; shall strictly conform to the requirements of the Task Order for such Project and this Contract; shall be fit, sufficient, and suitable for the purposes expressed in, or reasonably inferred from, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract; and shall be performed in accordance with the standards of professional practice, care, and diligence practiced by recognized consulting firms in performing services of a similar nature in existence at the time of performance of the Services. The representation herein expressed shall be in addition to any other representations and warranties expressed in the Task Order for such Project or this Contract, or expressed or implied by law, which are hereby reserved unto Owner.

B. Opinions of Cost. It is recognized that neither Consultant nor Owner has control over the costs of labor, material, equipment or services furnished by others or over competitive bidding, market or negotiating conditions, or construction contractors' methods of determining their prices. Accordingly, any opinions of probable Project costs or construction costs provided for herein are estimates only, made on the basis of Consultant's experience and qualifications and represent Consultant's best judgment as an experienced and qualified professional, familiar with the industry. Consultant does not guaranty that proposals, bids or actual Project costs or construction costs will not vary from opinions of probable cost prepared by Consultant.

## 3.2 Corrections

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall be responsible for the quality, technical accuracy, completeness and coordination of all reports, documents, data, information and other items and services under the Task Order for such Project and this Contract, as required under the applicable standard of care. Consultant shall, promptly and without charge, provide, to the satisfaction of Owner, all corrective Services necessary as a result of Consultant's negligent acts, errors, or omissions, or failure to meet representation.

#### 3.3 Risk of Loss

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the Services and everything pertaining thereto shall be provided, performed, and completed at the sole risk and cost of Consultant. Consultant shall be responsible for any and all damages to property or persons as a result of Consultant's negligent acts, errors, or omissions, or failure to meet representation and for any losses or costs to repair or remedy any work undertaken by Owner based upon the Services as a result of any such negligent acts, errors, or omissions, or failure to meet representation. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Contract, Consultant's obligations under this Section 3.3 shall exist without regard to, and shall not be construed to be waived by, the availability or unavailability of any insurance, either of Owner or Consultant, to indemnify, hold harmless or reimburse Consultant for such damages, losses or costs.

## ARTICLE IV FINANCIAL ASSURANCES

#### 4.1 <u>Insurance</u>

- A. <u>Insurance Required</u>. Contemporaneous with Consultant's execution of this Contract, Consultant shall provide certificates or policies of insurance evidencing at least the minimum insurance coverages and limits set forth below as required. For good cause shown, Owner may extend the time for submission of the required certificates or policies of insurance upon such terms, and with such assurances of complete and prompt performance, as Owner may impose in the exercise of its sole discretion. Such policies shall be in a form acceptable to Owner and from companies with a general rating of A, and a financial size category of Class V or better, in Best's Insurance Guide and otherwise acceptable to Owner. Such insurance shall provide that no cancellation of any insurance shall become effective until the expiration of 30 days after written notice thereof shall have been given by the insurance company to Owner, with ten day exception for non-payment of premium.
- B. <u>Minimum Coverages</u>. Consultant shall, at all times while providing, performing, or completing the Services, including, without limitation, at all times while correcting any failure to meet representation pursuant to Section 3.2 of this Contract, maintain and keep in force, at Consultant's expense, at least the following minimum insurance coverages and limits:
- 1. <u>Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability</u> with limits not less than:
  - (a) <u>Worker's Compensation</u>: Statutory;
  - (b) <u>Employer's Liability</u>:

\$1,000,000 injury-per occurrence

\$1,000,000 disease-per employee

\$1,000,000 disease-policy limit

The insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against the Owner its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers for losses arising from work performed by the Consultant for the Owner.

2. <u>Commercial Motor Vehicle Liability</u> with a combined single limit of liability for bodily injury and property damage of not less than \$1,000,000 for vehicles owned, non-owned, or rented.

All employees shall be included as insureds. ISO Business Auto Liability coverage form CA0001, Symbol 01 "Any Auto" shall be provided.

3. <u>Commercial General Liability</u> with coverage written on an "occurrence" basis and with a combined single limit of liability for bodily injury and property damage of not less than \$2,000,000.

## Coverages shall include:

- Broad Form Property Damage Endorsement
- Blanket Contractual Liability
- Personal Injury
- Bodily injury and property damage
- "X", "C", and "U" exclusions shall be deleted

ISO Additional Insured Endorsement CG2010 shall be provided.

4. Professional Liability Insurance with a limit of liability of not less than \$2,000,000 per claim/annual aggregate, an extended reporting period of not less than three-years if coverage is written on a "claims made" basis, and covering Consultant against claims caused by Consultant's negligent act, error or omission in the performance of professional services under this Contract and each Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract.

If the policy is written on a claims made form, the retroactive date must be equal to or preceding the effective date of the contract. In the event the policy is cancelled, non-renewed, or switched to an occurrence form, the Consultant shall be required to purchase supplemental extending reporting period coverage for a period of not less than three years. Insurance shall provide indemnification for injury or damage arising out of acts, errors, or omissions in providing the following professional services, but not limited to the following:

- Preparing, approving, failure to prepare or approve maps, drawings, opinions, reports, surveys, change orders, designs, or specifications.
- Providing direction, instruction, supervision, inspection, engineering services, or failing to provide them, if that is the primary cause of injury or damage.

Insurance shall provide indemnification for injury or damage arising out of *negligent* acts, errors, or omissions in providing the following professional services, but not limited to the following:

5. <u>Umbrella Policy</u>. The required coverages may be in any combination of primary, excess, and umbrella policies. Any excess or umbrella policy must provide excess coverage over underlying insurance on a following-form basis such that when any loss covered by the primary policy

exceeds the limits under the primary policy, the excess or umbrella policy becomes effective to cover such loss.

## C. General Requirements

- 1. Insurance shall contain a Severability of Interests / Cross liability clause or language stating the Consultant's insurance shall apply separately to each insured whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- 2. The Consultant shall furnish the Owner certificates of insurance naming the Village, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers as additional insureds (except for Workers Compensation and Professional Liability), and with original endorsements affecting coverage required by this clause. Certificates and endorsements for each insurance policy shall be signed by a person authorized by that insured to buying coverage on its behalf. The additional insured endorsements shall be on Insurance Service Office (ISO) forms: CG201 or CG2026. The Village reserves the right to request fully certified copies of insurance policies and endorsements.
- 3. The Consultant shall include all subcontractors as insureds under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates and endorsements for each subcontractor. All coverages for subcontractors shall be subject to all the requirements state herein.

## 4.2 Indemnification

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall, without regard to the availability or unavailability of any insurance, either of Owner or Consultant, indemnify, and save harmless Owner against lawsuits, claims, demands, damages, liabilities, losses, and expenses, including attorneys' fees and administrative expenses, that may arise out of or in connection with Consultant's negligent acts, errors, or omissions, or failure to perform the Services or any part thereof, except to the extent caused by the negligence of Owner.

## ARTICLE V PAYMENT

## 5.1 Contract Price

A. For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner shall pay to Consultant, in accordance with and subject to the

terms and conditions set forth in this Article V and in such Task Order, and Consultant shall accept in full satisfaction for providing, performing, and completing the Services, the amount or amounts set forth in such Task Order (the "Contract Price"), subject to any additions, deductions, or withholdings provided for in this Contract.

B. For all services provided which are not covered by a Task Order, the Consultant shall invoice the Village on an hourly basis for direct labor to perform the work at a rate set forth in Attachment C. The Village may request an estimate of fee for approval before work commences. If an estimate is provided, the Consultant shall not exceed the estimated fee without prior approval of the Village.

#### 5.2 <u>Taxes, Benefits and Royalties</u>

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the Contract Price includes all applicable federal, state, and local taxes of every kind and nature applicable to the Services as well as all taxes, contributions, and premiums for unemployment insurance, old age or retirement benefits, pensions, annuities, or other similar benefits and all costs, royalties, and fees arising from the use on, or the incorporation into, the Services, of patented equipment, materials, supplies, tools, appliances, devices, processes, or inventions. All claim or right to claim additional compensation by reason of the payment of any such tax, contribution, premium, costs, royalties, or fees is hereby waived and released by Consultant.

## 5.3 Progress Payments

- A. <u>Payment in Installments</u>. For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the Contract Price shall be paid in monthly installments in the manner set forth in the Task Order for such Project ("Progress Payments").
- B. Pay Requests. Consultant shall, as a condition precedent to its right to receive each Progress Payment, submit to Owner an invoice accompanied by such receipts, vouchers, and other documents as may be necessary to establish Consultant's prior payment for all labor, material, and other things covered by the invoice and the absence of any interest, whether in the nature of a lien or otherwise, of any party in any property, work, or fund with respect to the Services performed under such Task Order. In addition to the foregoing, such invoice shall include (a) employee classifications, rates per hour, and hours worked by each classification, and, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, for each phase; (b) total amount billed in the current period and total amount billed to date, and, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, for each phase; (c) the estimated percent completion, and, if

the Services are to be performed in separate phases, for each phase; and (d) Consultant's certification that all prior Progress Payments have been properly applied to the Services with respect to which they were paid. Owner may, by written notice to Consultant, designate a specific day of each month on or before which pay requests must be submitted.

Date of Payment. For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall be paid for all Services done in compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract up to the day before the pay request, less the aggregate of all previous Progress Payments under such Task Order, no later than 45 days following submission of such pay request; provided, however, that Owner shall not be obligated to make any Progress Payment unless and until Consultant has submitted all required data and documentation to Owner and such documentation and data is complete and in proper form. The person designated by Owner to act as Owner's representative and on Owner's behalf with respect to the Services under such Task Order shall notify Consultant within 14 days following submission of a pay request of any deficiency in the pay request or any dispute as to the amount of the Progress Payment requested; provided, however, that failure to give such notice shall not waive or diminish Owner's rights or remedies under this Contract.

## 5.4 Final Acceptance and Final Payment

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the Services, or, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, each phase of the Services, shall be considered complete on the date of final written acceptance by Owner of the Services or each phase of the Services, as the case may be, which acceptance shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. The Services or each phase of the Services, as the case may be, shall be deemed accepted by Owner if not objected to in writing within 60 days after submission by Consultant of the Services or such phase of Services for final acceptance and payment plus, if applicable, such additional time as may be considered reasonable for obtaining approval of governmental authorities having jurisdiction to approve the Services, or phase of Services, as the case may be. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner shall pay to Consultant, as soon as practicable after final acceptance, the balance of the Contract Price or, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, the balance of that portion of the Contract Price with respect to such phase of the Services, after deducting therefrom all charges against Consultant as provided for in this Contract ("Final Payment"). For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the acceptance by Consultant of Final Payment with respect to the Services or a particular phase of Services under such Task Order, as the case may be, shall operate as a full and complete release of Owner of and from any and all lawsuits, claims, demands, damages, liabilities, losses, and expenses of, by, or to Consultant for anything done, furnished for, arising out of, relating to, or in connection with the Services or a particular phase of Services under such Task Order, as the case may be, or for or on account of any act or neglect of Owner arising out of, relating to, or in connection with the Services or a particular phase of Services under such Task Order, as the case may be.

#### 5.5 Deductions

- Owner's Right to Withhold. Notwithstanding any other provision of this A. Contract and without prejudice to any of Owner's other rights or remedies, for all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner shall have the right at any time or times, whether before or after approval of any pay request, to deduct and withhold from any Progress or Final Payment that may be or become due such amount as may reasonably appear necessary to compensate Owner for any actual or prospective loss due (1) Services that are defective, damaged, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, or incomplete; (2) damage for which Consultant is liable under this Contract; (3) liens or claims of lien regardless of merit; (4) claims of subcontractors, suppliers, or other persons regardless of merit; (5) delay in the progress or completion of the Services; (6) inability of Consultant to complete the Services: (7) failure of Consultant to properly complete or document any pay request; (8) any other failure of Consultant to perform any of its obligations under the Task Order for such Project and this Contract; or (9) the cost to Owner, including attorneys' fees and administrative costs, of correcting any of the aforesaid matters or exercising any one or more of Owner's remedies set forth in Section 6.1 of this Contract.
- B. <u>Use of Withheld Funds</u>. Owner shall be entitled to retain any and all amounts withheld pursuant to Subsection 5.5A above until Consultant shall have either performed the obligations in question or furnished security for such performance satisfactory to Owner. Owner shall be entitled to apply any money withheld or any other money due Consultant under this Contract to reimburse itself for any and all costs, expenses, losses, damages, liabilities, suits, judgments, awards, attorneys' fees, and administrative expenses incurred, suffered, or sustained by Owner and chargeable to Consultant under this Contract.

#### 5.6 Accounting

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall keep accounts, books, and other records of all its billable charges and costs incurred in performing the Services in accordance

with generally accepted accounting practices, consistently applied, and in such manner as to permit verification of all entries. Consultant shall make all such material available for inspection by Owner, at all reasonable times during this Contract and for a period of three years following termination of this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract. Copies of such material shall be furnished, at Owner's expense, upon request.

## ARTICLE VI REMEDIES

#### 6.1 Owner's Remedies

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, if it should appear at any time prior to Final Payment for all work that Consultant has failed or refused to prosecute, or has delayed in the prosecution of, the Services with diligence at a rate that assures completion of the Services in full compliance with the requirements of the Task Order for such Project and this Contract, or has attempted to assign the Task Order for such Project or this Contract or Consultant's rights under the Task Order for such Project or this Contract, either in whole or in part, or has falsely made any representation or warranty in the Task Order for such Project or this Contract, or has otherwise failed, refused, or delayed to perform or satisfy any other requirement of the Task Order for such Project or this Contract or has failed to pay its debts as they come due ("Event of Default"), and has failed to cure any such Event of Default within five business days after Consultant's receipt of written notice of such Event of Default, then Owner shall have the right, at its election and without prejudice to any other remedies provided by law or equity, to pursue any one or more of the following remedies:

- 1. Owner may require Consultant, within such reasonable time as may be fixed by Owner, to complete or correct all or any part of the Services that are defective, damaged, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, or incomplete; to accelerate all or any part of the Services; and to take any or all other action necessary to bring Consultant and the Services into strict compliance with the Task Order for such Project and this Contract.
- 2. Owner may accept the defective, damaged, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, incomplete, or dilatory Services or part thereof and make an equitable reduction in the Contract Price for such Task Order.
- 3. Owner may terminate the Task Order for such Project without liability for further payment of amounts due or to become due under the Task Order for such Project except payment of amounts due or to become due under the Task Order for such Project for all Services done in compliance with, and as required by or

pursuant to, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract up to the effective date of termination.

- 4. Owner may withhold from any Progress Payment or Final Payment that may be or become due under such Task Order, whether or not previously approved, or may recover from Consultant, any and all costs, including attorneys' fees and administrative expenses, incurred by Owner as the result of any Event of Default or as a result of actions taken by Owner in response to any Event of Default.
- 5. Owner may recover any damages suffered by Owner as the result of any Event of Default.

## 6.2 <u>Terminations and Suspensions Deemed for Convenience</u>

Any termination or suspension of Consultant's rights under a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract for an alleged default that is ultimately held unjustified shall automatically be deemed to be a termination or suspension for the convenience of Owner under Section 1.9 of this Contract.

## ARTICLE VII LEGAL RELATIONSHIPS AND REQUIREMENTS

## 7.1 Binding Effect

This Contract, and all Task Orders issued pursuant to this Contract, shall be binding upon Owner and Consultant and upon their respective heirs, executors, administrators, personal representatives, and permitted successors and assigns. Every reference in this Contract to a party shall also be deemed to be a reference to the authorized officers, employees, agents, and representatives of such party.

## 7.2 Relationship of the Parties

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall act as an independent contractor in providing and performing the Services. Nothing in, nor done pursuant to, this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract shall be construed (1) to create the relationship of principal and agent, partners, or joint venturers between Owner and Consultant or (2) to create any relationship between Owner and any subcontractor of Consultant.

#### 7.3 No Collusion

Consultant hereby represents and certifies that Consultant is not barred from contracting with a unit of state or local government as a result of (i) a delinquency in the payment of any tax administered by the Illinois Department of Revenue unless Consultant is contesting, in accordance with the procedures established by the appropriate revenue Act, its liability for the tax or the amount of the tax, as set forth in 65 ILCS 5/11-42.1-1; or (ii) a violation of either Section 33E-3 or Section 33E-4 of Article 33E of the Criminal Code of 1961, 720 ILCS 5/33E-1 et seq. Consultant hereby represents that the only persons, firms, or corporations interested in this Contract as principals are those disclosed to Owner prior to the execution of this Contract, and that this Contract is made without collusion with any other person, firm, or corporation. If at any time it shall be found that Consultant has, in procuring this Contract, colluded with any other person, firm, or corporation, then Consultant shall be liable to Owner for all loss or damage that Owner may suffer thereby, and this Contract shall, at Owner's option, be null and void.

## 7.4 Assignment

Neither Owner nor Consultant shall (1) assign this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, in whole or in part, (2) assign any of their respective rights or obligations under this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, or (3) assign any payment due or to become due under this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract without the prior express written approval of the other party to this Contract, which approval may be withheld in the sole and unfettered discretion of the party whose approval is required; provided, however, that the other party's prior written approval shall not be required for assignments of accounts, as defined in the Illinois Commercial Code, if to do so would violate Section 9-318 of the Illinois Commercial Code, 810 ILCS 5/9-318.

## 7.5 Confidential Information

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, all information supplied by Owner to Consultant for or in connection with the Task Order for such Project or the Services under such Task Order shall be held confidential by Consultant and shall not, without the prior express written consent of Owner, be used for any purpose other than performance of the Services under such Task Order.

#### 7.6 No Waiver

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, no examination, inspection, investigation, test, measurement,

review, determination, decision, certificate, or approval by Owner, nor any order by Owner for the payment of money, nor any payment for, or use, occupancy, possession, or acceptance of, the whole or any part of the Services by Owner, nor any extension of time granted by Owner, nor any delay by Owner in exercising any right under the Task Order for such Project or this Contract, nor any other act or omission of Owner shall constitute or be deemed to be an acceptance of any defective, damaged, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, or incomplete Services, nor operate to waive or otherwise diminish the effect of any warranty or representation made by Consultant; or of any requirement or provision of the Task Order for such Project or this Contract; or of any remedy, power, or right of Owner.

## 7.7 No Third Party Beneficiaries

No claim as a third party beneficiary under this Contract or under any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract by any person, firm, or corporation other than Consultant shall be made or be valid against Owner.

#### 7.8 Notices

All notices required or permitted to be given under this Contract shall be in writing and shall be deemed received by the addressee thereof when delivered in person on a business day at the address set forth below or on the third business day after being deposited in any main or branch United States post office, for delivery at the address set forth below by properly addressed, postage prepaid, certified or registered mail, return receipt requested.

Notices and communications to Owner shall be addressed to, and delivered at, the following address:

Notices and communications to Consultant shall be addressed to, and delivered at, the following address:

HR Green, Inc. 420 North Front Street, Suite 100 McHenry, Illinois 60050 Attention: Chad J. Pieper, P.E. The foregoing shall not be deemed to preclude the use of other non-oral means of notification or to invalidate any notice properly given by any such other non-oral means.

By notice complying with the requirements of this Section 7.8, Owner and Consultant each shall have the right to change the address or addressee or both for all future notices to it, but no notice of a change of address or addressee shall be effective until actually received.

## 7.9 Governing Laws

This Contract and each Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, and the rights of Owner and Consultant under this Contract and each Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, shall be interpreted according to the internal laws, but not the conflict of laws rules, of the State of Illinois.

#### 7.10 Changes in Laws

Unless otherwise explicitly provided in this Contract or in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, any reference to laws shall include such laws as they may be amended or modified from time to time.

## 7.11 Compliance with Laws and Grants

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall give all notices, pay all fees, and take all other action that may be necessary to ensure that the Services are provided, performed, and completed in accordance with all required governmental permits, licenses, or other approvals and authorizations that may be required in connection with providing, performing, and completing the Services, and with all applicable statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations, including without limitation the Fair Labor Standards Act; any statutes regarding qualification to do business; any statutes prohibiting discrimination because of, or requiring affirmative action based on, race, creed, color, national origin, age, sex, or other prohibited classification, including, without limitation, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 et seq., and the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall also comply with all conditions of any federal, state, or local grant received by Owner or Consultant with respect to such Project or the Services under the Task Order for such Project.

Consultant shall be solely liable for any fines or civil penalties that are imposed by any governmental or quasi-governmental agency or body that may arise, or be alleged to have arisen, out of or in connection with Consultant's, or its subcontractors', performance of, or failure to perform, the Services under any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract or any part thereof. Every provision of law required by law to be inserted into this Contract or in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract shall be deemed to be inserted herein or therein.

#### 7.12 Documents

For all services provided as Village Engineer (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, drawings, plans, specifications, photos, reports, information, observations, calculations, notes and any other reports, documents, data or information, in any form, prepared, collected, or received by Consultant in connection with any or all of the Services (the "Documents") shall be and remain the property of Owner. At Owner's request, or upon termination of this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the Documents shall be delivered promptly to Owner. Consultant shall have the right to retain copies of the Documents for its files. Consultant shall maintain files of all Documents unless Owner shall consent in writing to the destruction of the Documents. Consultant shall make, and shall cause all of its subcontractors to make, the Documents available for Owner's review, inspection and audit during the entire term of this Contract and for three years after termination of this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract; provided, however, that prior to the disposal or destruction of the Documents by Consultant or any of its subcontractors following said three year period, Consultant shall give notice to Owner of any Documents to be disposed of or destroyed and the intended date, which shall be at least 90 days after the effective date of such notice of disposal or destruction. Owner shall have 90 days after receipt of any such notice to give notice to Consultant or any of its subcontractors not to dispose of or destroy said Documents and to require Consultant or any of its subcontractors to deliver same to Owner, at Owner's expense.

The Owner acknowledges the Consultant's construction documents, including electronic files of those construction documents, as instruments of professional service. Nevertheless, the final construction documents, including electronic files of those construction documents prepared under this Agreement shall become the property of the Owner upon completion of the services and payment in full of all monies due to the Consultant. The Client shall not reuse or make any modification to the construction documents, including electronic files of those construction documents without the prior written authorization of the Consultant. The Owner agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to indemnify and hold harmless the Consultant, its officers, directors, employees, and subconsultants (collectively, Consultant) against any damages, liabilities, or costs, including attorney's fees and defense costs, arising from or allegedly arising from or in any way connected with the unauthorized reuse or modification of the construction documents, including electronic files of those construction documents by the Owner or any person or entity that acquires or obtains the construction documents, including electronic files of those

construction documents from or through the Owner without the written authorization of the Consultant.

#### 7.13 <u>Time</u>

The Owner and Consultant are aware that many factors outside the Consultant's control may affect the Consultant's ability to complete the services to be provided under this Agreement. The Consultant will perform these services with reasonable diligence and expediency consistent with sound professional practices. Services performed under a task order will be performed in accordance with the time frame included in the task order.

#### 7.14 Severability

The provisions of this Contract and each Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract shall be interpreted when possible to sustain their legality and enforceability as a whole. In the event any provision of this Contract or a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract shall be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, in whole or in part, neither the validity of the remaining part of such provision, nor the validity of any other provisions of this Contract or such Task Order shall be in any way affected thereby.

#### 7.15 Entire Agreement

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, this Contract and the Task Order for such Project set forth the entire agreement of Owner and Consultant with respect to the accomplishment of the Services under such Task Order and the payment of the Contract Price therefor, and there are no other understandings or agreements, oral or written, between Owner and Consultant with respect to the Services under such Task Order and the compensation therefor.

#### 7.16 Amendments

No modification, addition, deletion, revision, alteration, or other change to this Contract shall be effective unless and until such change is reduced to writing and executed and delivered by Owner and Consultant.

#### ATTACHMENT A

#### DESCRIPTION OF BASIC SERVICES

Consultant shall cooperate and work closely with representatives of Owner and other parties involved in each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to the Contract. Consultant shall meet with Owner and such other parties, and shall provide such consultation, advice, and reports, as required to adequately perform its responsibilities under each such Task Order and the Contract. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall produce and deliver to Owner the results of its Services, plus any reports, documents, data, information, observations, or opinions set forth below that are required to be provided under the Task Order for such Project or requested by Owner, in form or format as set forth below or, if none, in form or format of Owner's choosing.

- 1. <u>Study and Report Phase</u>. If Study and Report Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Study and Report Services shall include one or more or all of the following as set forth in the Task Order:
  - a. Review available data and consult with Owner to determine a mutually agreed upon program, schedule and preliminary construction budget.
  - b. Provide analysis of Owner's needs, planning surveys, and site evaluation and comparative studies of prospective sites and solutions.
  - c. Provide economic analysis of various alternatives.
  - d. Prepare, for review and approval by Owner, a report summarizing the Study and Report Services, together with Consultant's opinion of probable Project Costs and Construction Cost of the Project and provide \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ copies and review them in person with Owner.
- 2. <u>Preliminary Design Phase</u>. If Preliminary Design Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Preliminary Design Services shall include one or more or all of the following as set forth in the Task Order:
  - a. Determine the general scope, extent and character the Project.
  - b. Prepare preliminary design documents consisting of drawings, specifications, a written description of the Project and other documents appropriate for Project.
  - c. Furnish <u>5</u> copies of the Preliminary Design Documents, together with Consultant's revised opinion of probable Project Costs and Construction Cost of the Project, for review and approval by Owner, and review them in person with Owner.

- 3. <u>Final Design Phase</u>. If Final Design Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Final Design Services shall include one or more or all of the following as set forth in the Task Order:
  - a. On basis of accepted Preliminary Design Documents and the revised opinion of probable Project Costs and Construction Cost of the Project, prepare pricing and quantity proposal forms, final drawings, and specifications for incorporation in the construction contract documents. Such drawings and specifications shall show the general scope, extent and character of the work to be furnished and performed by the construction contractor.
  - b. Assist Owner by providing all required criteria, descriptions and design data and consulting with officials and Owner to obtain permits and to prepare other bidding/negotiation and construction contract documents.
  - c. Furnish <u>5</u> copies of the proposal forms, drawings and specifications, together with Consultant's revised opinion of probable Project Costs and Construction Cost of the Project, based upon the drawings and specifications and the other bidding/negotiation and construction contract documents, for review and approval by Owner, and review them in person with Owner.
- 4. <u>Bidding or Negotiating Phase</u>. If Bidding or Negotiating Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Bidding or Negotiating Services shall include one or more or all of the following as set forth in the Task Order:
  - a. Assist Owner in advertising for and obtaining bids or negotiating proposals. Maintain a record of prospective bidders to whom bidding documents have been issue and attend pre-bid or negotiation conferences.
  - b. Issue addenda as appropriate and approved by Owner.
  - c. Consult with and advise Owner as to the acceptability of contractors, subcontractors, suppliers and other persons if such acceptability is required by the construction contract documents.
  - d. Consult with Owner as to acceptability of proposed substitute materials and equipment.
  - e. Attend bid openings, prepare bid or negotiation tabulation sheets, and assist Owner in evaluating bids or proposals and in assembling and awarding construction contracts.
- 5. <u>Construction Phase</u>. If Construction Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Construction Services shall include one or more or all of the following as set forth in the Task Order:

- a. Furnish advice and consulting services during the construction period.
- b. Review, return and comment on shop drawings and other equipment drawings furnished by contractors for materials and equipment to be incorporated into the work. Submittals shall be returned within 30 days of receipt by Consultant.
- c. Consult and advise on the interpretation of the construction contracts.
- d. Provide a representative to observe the construction of the work on a daily basis; such representative to be acceptable to Owner at all times. On the basis of such observation, Consultant may disapprove of or reject construction work while it is in progress if it does not conform to the construction contract or will prejudice the integrity of the design concept.
- e. Assist Owner and field personnel in checking laboratory tests of construction materials and equipment which are to be incorporated into the work.
- f. Review contractors' breakdown of cost, material quantities and scheduling.
- g. Prepare monthly estimates and certification of construction progress payments, and report to Owner as required to keep Owner informed on the progress of construction and to allow Owner to perform its obligations under the construction contracts.
- h. Prepare and submit proposed change orders to Owner for its consideration, approval or denial. Consultant shall, when requested, submit recommendations on proposed change orders.
- i. Maintain daily records of construction, including logs of weather conditions, accident reports, work accomplished, manpower, equipment and materials used, and problems encountered.
- j. Schedule and attend preconstruction and job conferences and promptly prepare and circulate minutes thereof to all participants.
- k. Maintain files of correspondence, reports of job conferences, field orders, addenda, change orders, shop drawings, samples, progress reports, product data, submittals, handbooks, operations and maintenance manuals, instructions and other project-related documents.
- l. Conduct final inspection of the construction work, and prepare punchlists for corrections and recommend, when the construction work is complete, final payment to the construction contractors.

- m. Prepare and continuously update drawings of record and submit <u>5</u> set(s) of reproducible drawings of record to Owner within 90 days from the completion of the construction contract.
- 6. <u>Operational Phase</u>. If Operational Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Operational Services shall include one or more or all of the following as set forth in the Task Order:
  - a. Provide assistance in the closing of any financial, refinancing or related transaction for the Project.
  - b. Assist Owner in training Owner's personnel to operate and maintain the Project and develop systems and procedures for operation, maintenance and recordkeeping for the Project.

In consideration of the mutual promises set forth below, the Village of Lake in the Hills, 600 Harvest Gate, Lake in the Hills, Illinois 60156, a unit of local government created and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois ("Owner"), and Baxter & Woodman, Inc. (and its subsidiaries) 8678 Ridgefield Road, Crystal Lake, IL 60012, an Illinois corporation ("Consultant"), make this Contract as of the \_\_\_20<sup>th</sup> \_\_\_ day of December, 2019 and hereby agree as follows:

#### ARTICLE I THE SERVICES

#### 1.1 Performance of the Services

#### A. Consultant's Services

- 1. <u>Water Resources Consultant</u>. Consultant shall perform the duties, without a Task Order, subject to such ordinances, rules, regulations, and directions as the Village President, Board of Trustees, and Village Administrator may from time to time establish including but not limited to the following:
  - a. General Engineering.
    - i. Undertaking investigations of minor potable water treatment, storage, and distribution engineering matters;
    - ii. Attendance at Village Board meetings, Committee of the Whole meetings, and staff meetings as required;
    - iii. Providing support for the preparation of drawings and maps to support Village Departments;
    - iv. Preparation of monthly status reports;
    - v. Assist in preparation of grant applications; and
    - vi. Providing timely information concerning changes to legislation, grant availability, and standards of engineering practice which could have an impact on Village programs.

- 2. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall, at its sole cost and expense, provide, perform, and complete all of the following, all of which is herein referred to as the "Services" subject to reimbursement of costs as described in the Task Order and this Contract:
  - a. <u>Labor, Equipment, Materials, and Supplies</u> Provide, perform, and complete, in the manner described and specified in the Task Order for such Project and this Contract, all necessary work, labor, services, transportation, equipment, materials, apparatus, information, data, and other items necessary for such Project in accordance with such of the basic engineering services set forth in Attachment A to this Contract as may be specified or referred to in the Task Order for such Project and such other engineering services as may be specified or referred to in the Task order for such Project and not set forth in Attachment A.
  - b. <u>Approvals</u> Procure and furnish all approvals and authorizations specified in the Task Order for such Project.
  - c. <u>Insurance</u> Procure and furnish all certificates and policies of insurance specified in this Contract and such other certificates and policies of insurance as may be specified in the Task Order for such Project.
  - d. <u>Quality</u> Provide, perform, and complete all of the foregoing in a proper and workmanlike manner, consistent with the standards of professional practice, care, and diligence practiced by recognized consulting firms in performing services of a similar nature in existence at the time of performance of the Services and in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, the task order for such Project and this Contract.
- B. <u>Task Orders</u> Consultant's Services shall be rendered in connection with such Projects as are delineated and described in Task Orders issued pursuant to this Contract. All Task Orders issued pursuant to this Contract shall be in the general form attached hereto as Attachment B, and all Services to be provided pursuant to any such Task Order shall be provided, performed, and completed in accordance with the terms and conditions contained in such Task Order and this Contract. Consultant and Owner shall agree on the scope of Services to be provided, the time for performance of the Services to be provided, and the cost or, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases with separate costs, the costs for each separate phase of Services to be provided under each Task Order. No Services shall be provided under this Contract without the issuance of a Task Order approved by Owner and Consultant.

The terms and conditions set forth in this Contract shall apply to each Task Order unless specifically modified in such Task Order. In the event of a conflict between this Contract and a Task Order, the conflicting provision of the Task Order shall take precedence for that Task Order. In the event this Contract is amended by Owner and Consultant, such amendment shall apply to all Task Orders issued after the effective date of the amendment and, unless otherwise

specifically provided in such amendment, shall not apply to any Task Orders issued prior to the effective date of the amendment.

No Task Order shall be issued pursuant to this Contract after December 31, 2019, unless such date is extended by amendment to this Contract. Owner reserves the right to employ other engineers on its projects and shall not be obligated to issue any Task Orders pursuant to this Contract.

#### 1.2 Commencement and Completion Dates

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall commence the Services not later than the "Commencement Date" set forth in the Task Order for such Project, and shall diligently and continuously prosecute the Services at such a rate as will allow the Services to be fully provided, performed, and completed in full compliance with the Task Order for such Project and this Contract not later than the "Completion Date" or, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases with separate completion dates, the "Completion Dates" set forth in the Task Order for such Project, as such Completion Date or Dates may be extended by a Change Order issued pursuant to Section 2.1 of this Contract due to changes in the Task order, the Project or the Services, or due to delays that result from causes that could not be avoided or controlled by Consultant in accordance with Article II of this Contract. The time of commencement, rate of progress, and time of completion for each task order issued pursuant to this Contract are referred to in this Contract as the "Contract Time".

#### 1.3 Required Submittals

- A. <u>Submittals Required</u> For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall submit to Owner all reports, documents, data, and information specifically set forth in the Task Order for such Project or otherwise required to be submitted by Consultant under this Contract and shall, in addition, submit to Owner all such reports, documents, data, and information as may be requested by Owner to fully document the Services for such Project ("Required Submittals"). In the event Owner requests Consultant to submit any such report, document, data, or information to fully document the Services that are not specifically set forth in the Task Order for such Project or otherwise required to be submitted by Consultant under this Contract, then an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price for such Task Order may be made in accordance with Section 2.1 of this Contract.
- B. <u>Time of Submission and Owner's Review</u> For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, all Required Submittals shall be provided to Owner no later than the time, if any specified in the Task Order for such Project or otherwise in this Contract. If no time for submission is specified for any Required Submittal, such Submittal shall be submitted within a reasonable time in light of its purpose and in all events, in sufficient time, but not less than 30 days in advance, to permit Owner to review the same prior to the commencement of any part of the Services to which such Required Submittal may relate. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner

shall have the right to require such corrections as may be necessary to make any Required Submittal conform to the Task Order for such Project and this Contract. No Services related to any Required Submittal shall be performed by Consultant until Owner has completed review of such Required Submittal with no exception noted. Owner's review and stamping of any Required Submittal shall not relieve Consultant of the entire responsibility for the performance of the Services in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to the Task Order for such Project and this Contract, and shall not be regarded as any assumption of risk or liability by Owner.

C. <u>Responsibility for Delay</u> For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall be responsible for any delay in the Services due to delay in providing Required Submittals confirming to the Task Order for such Project and this Contract that could have been avoided or controlled by Consultant.

#### 1.4 Review and Incorporation of Contract Provisions

Consultant represents that it has carefully reviewed, and fully understood, this Contract, including all of its Attachments, and, by its approval of each Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, that it has carefully reviewed, and fully understood, each such Task Order, all of which are by this reference incorporated into and made a part of this Contract.

#### 1.5 Financial and Technical Ability to Perform

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant represents, by its approval of such Task Order, that it is financially solvent, and has the financial resources necessary, and that it is sufficiently experienced and competent, and has the necessary capital, facilities, plant, organization, and staff necessary, to provide perform, and complete the Services in full compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract.

#### **1.6** Time

#### 1.7 Consultant's Personnel and Subcontractors

A. <u>Consultant's Personnel</u> For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall provide all personnel necessary to complete the Services, including without limitation the "Key Project Personnel" identified in the Task Order for such Project. Consultant shall provide to Owner telephone numbers at which the Key Project

Personnel for such Task Order can be reached on a 24 hour basis. Consultant and Owner may, by mutual written agreement, make changes and additions to the designations of Key Project Personnel in such Task Order. Consultant shall notify Owner as soon as practicable prior to terminating the employment of any such designated Key Project Personnel to other positions, or upon receiving notification of the resignation of any of such designated Key Project Personnel. Consultant shall submit justification, including a description of proposed substitute personnel, in sufficient detail to permit evaluation by Owner of the impact of the proposed action on the Services to be provided, performed and completed under such Task Order. No such reassignment shall be made by Consultant without prior written approval of Owner. Consultant shall have no claim for damages, for compensation in excess of the Contract Price for such Task Order, or for a delay or extension of the Contract Time for such Task Order as a result of any such termination, reassignment, resignation, or substitution.

- В. Approval and Use of Subcontractors For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall perform the Services with its own personnel and under the management, supervision, and control of its own organization unless otherwise approved by Owner in writing. All subcontractors and subcontracts used by Consultant shall be acceptable to, and approved in advance by, Owner. Owner's approval of any subcontractor or subcontract shall not relieve Consultant of full responsibility and liability for the provision, performance and completion of the Services in full compliance with, as required by or pursuant to, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract. All Services performed under any subcontract shall be subject to all of the provisions of the Task Order for such Project and this Contract in the same manner as if performed by employees of Consultant. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, every reference in the Task Order for such Project and in this Contract to "Consultant" shall be deemed also to refer to all subcontractors of Consultant, and every subcontract shall include a provision binding the subcontractor to all provisions of the Task Order for such Project and this Contract.
- C. <u>Removal of Personnel Subcontractors</u> For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, if any personnel or subcontractor fails to perform the part of the Services undertaken by it in a manner satisfactory to Owner, Consultant shall immediately upon notice from Owner remove the replace such personnel or subcontractor. Consultant shall have no claim for damages, for compensation in excess of the Contract Price for such Task Order, or for a delay or extension of the Contract Time for such Task Order as a result of any such removal or replacement.

#### 1.8 Owner's Responsibilities

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner shall, at it's sole cost and expense and except as otherwise provided in the Task Order for such Project: (a) designate in writing a person with authority to act as Owner's representative and on Owner's behalf with respect to the Services except those matters that may require Board approval

of Owner (b) provide to Consultant all criteria and full information as to Owner's requirements for the Project or work to which the services relate, including Owner's objectives and constraints, schedule, space, capacity and performance requirements, and budgetary limitations relevant to the Project; (c) provide to Consultant all existing studies, reports, and other available data relevant to the project; (d) arrange for access to and make all provisions for Consultant to enter upon public and private property as reasonable required for Consultant to perform the Services; (e) provide surveys describing physical characteristics, legal limitations, and utility locations for the Project and the services of geotechnical engineers or other consultants when such services are reasonably requested by the Consultant, are necessary for the performance of the Services, and are not already provided for in the Task Order for the Project; (f) provide structural, mechanical, chemical, air and water pollution tests, test for hazardous materials, and other laboratory and environmental tests, inspections, and reports required by law to be provided by Owner in connection with the Project; (g) distribute to all applicable departments within Owner's organization for review and comment, and review and comment on, all Required Submittals and other reports, documents, data, and information presented by Consultant; (h) except as otherwise provided in the Task Order for the Project, provide approvals from all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project when such services are reasonably requested by the Consultant, are necessary for the performance of the Services, and are not already provided for in the Task Order for the Project; (j) attend Project related meetings; and (k) give prompt written notice to Consultant whenever Owner observes or otherwise becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or timing of the Services; provided, however, that failure to give such notice shall not relieve Consultant of any of its responsibilities under the Task Order for the Project or this Contract.

#### 1.9 Owner's Right to Terminate or Suspend Services for Convenience

- A. <u>Termination or Suspension for Convenience</u> Owner shall have the right, for its convenience, to terminate or suspend the Services under any Task Order in whole or in part at any time by written notice to Consultant. Every such notice shall state the extent and effective date of such termination or suspension. The effective date shall be a minimum of ten calendar days after receipt of notice by the Consultant. Upon notice, Consultant shall, as and to the extent directed, stop Services under such Task Order, cease all placement of further orders or subcontracts under such Task Order, terminate or suspend Services under existing orders and subcontract for such Task Order, and cancel any outstanding orders or subcontracts under such Task Order that may be canceled.
- B. <u>Payment for Completed Services</u> In the event of any termination pursuant to Subsection 1.9A above, Owner shall pay Consultant (1) Consultant's Direct Labor Costs and Reimbursable Expenses, as defined in the Task Order for such Project, for all Services done in compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract up to the effective date of termination; and (2) such other costs pertaining to the Services, inclusive of overhead and profit, as Consultant may have reasonably necessarily incurred as the result of such termination. Any such payment shall be offset by any prior payment or payments under such Task Order and shall be subject to Owner's rights to withhold and deduct as provided in this Contract.

#### ARTICLE II CHANGES AND DELAYS

#### 2.1 Changes

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner shall have the right, by written order executed by Owner, to make changes in the Task Order, the Project, the Services and the Contract Time ("Change Order"). If any Change Order causes an increase or decrease in the amount of the Services, an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price or Contract Time for such Task Order any be made. No decrease in the amount of the Services caused by any Change Order shall entitle Consultant to make any claim for damages, anticipated profits, or other compensation.

#### 2.2 Delays

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall, upon timely written application, be entitled to issuance of a Change Order providing for an extension of the Contract Time for such Task Order for a period of time equal to the delay resulting from causes that could not be avoided or controlled by Consultant. No extension of the Contract Time for such Task Order shall be allowed for any other delay in completion of the Services.

#### 2.3 No Constructive Change Orders

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, no claims for equitable adjustments in the Contract Price or Contract Time for such Task Order shall be made or allowed unless embodied in a Change Order. If Owner fails to issue a Change Order for such Task Order including, or fully including, an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price or Contract Time to which Consultant claims it is entitled, or, if Consultant believes that any requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision of Owner entitles Consultant to an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price or Contract Time that has not been included, or fully included, in a Change Order for such Task Order, then Consultant shall submit to Owner a written request for the issuance of, or revision of, a Change Order for such Task Order, including the equitable adjustment, or the additional equitable adjustment, in the Contract Price or Contract Time that Consultant claims has not been included, or fully included in a Change Order for such Task Order. Such request shall be submitted before Consultant proceeds with any Services for which Consultant claims an equitable adjustment is due and shall, in all events, be submitted no later than two business days after receipt of such Change Order or receipt of notice of such requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision. Notwithstanding the submission of any such request, Consultant shall, unless otherwise directed by Owner within two business days after receipt by Owner of such request, proceed without delay to perform the Services in compliance with the Change Order or as required, directed, instructed, interpreted, or decided by Owner and shall, pending a final resolution of the issue, keep a daily record of such Services. Unless Consultant submits such a request within two business days after receipt of such Change Order or receipt of notice of such

requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision, Consultant shall be conclusively deemed (1) to have agreed that such Change Order, requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision does not entitle Consultant to an equitable adjustment in the Contract Price or Contract Time for such Task Order and (2) to have waived all claims based on such Change Order, requirement, direction, instruction, interpretation, determination, or decision.

#### ARTICLE III CONSULTANT'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR DEFECTIVE SERVICES

#### 3.1 Representation of Services

- For all services provided as Water Resources Α. Scope of Representation Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall exercise the appropriate standard of care to assure that the Services and all of its components shall be free from defects and flaws in design; shall strictly conform to the requirements of the Task Order for such Project and this Contract; shall be fit, sufficient, and suitable for the purposes expressed in, or reasonably inferred from, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract; and shall be performed in accordance with the standards of profession practice, care, and diligence practiced by recognized consulting firms in performing services of a similar nature in existence at the time of performance of the Services. The representation herein expressed shall be in addition to any other representation and warranties expressed in the Task Order for such Project and this Contract; shall be fit, sufficient, and suitable for the purposes expressed in, or reasonably inferred from, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract; and shall be performed in accordance with the standards of professional practice, care, and diligence practiced by recognized consulting firms in performing services of a similar nature in existence at the time of performance of the Services. The representation herein expressed shall be in addition to any other representation and warranties expressed in the Task Order for such project or this Contract, or expressed or implied by law, which are hereby reserved unto Owner.
- B. Opinions of Cost It is recognized that neither Consultant nor Owner has control over the costs of labor, material, equipment or services furnished by others or over competitive bidding market or negotiating conditions, or construction contractor's methods of determining their prices. Accordingly, any opinions of probable Project costs or construction costs provided for herein are estimates only, made on the basis of Consultant's experience and qualifications and represent Consultant's best judgment as an experienced and qualified professional, familiar with the industry. Consultant does not guaranty that proposals, bids or actual Project costs or construction costs will not vary from opinions of probable cost prepared by Consultant.

#### 3.2 Corrections

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall be responsible for the quality, technical accuracy, completeness and coordination of all reports, documents, data, information and other items and services under the Task Order for such Project and this Contract. Consultant shall promptly and without charge, provide, to the satisfaction of Owner, all corrective Services necessary as a result of Consultant's negligent acts, errors, or omissions, or failure to meet representation.

#### 3.3 Risk of Loss

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the Services and everything pertaining thereto shall be provided, performed, and completed at the sole risk and cost of consultant. Consultant shall be responsible for any and all damages to property or persons as a result of Consultant's negligent acts, errors, or omissions, or failure to meet appropriate standards of care and for any losses or costs to repair or remedy any work undertaken by Owner based upon the Services as a result of any such negligent acts, errors, or omissions, or failure to meet appropriate standards of care. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Contract, Consultant's obligations under this Section 3.3 shall exist without regard to, and shall not be construed to be waived by, the availability or unavailability of any insurance, either of Owner or Consultant, to indemnify, hold harmless or reimburse Consultant for such damages, losses or costs.

#### ARTICLE IV FINANCIAL ASSURANCES

#### 4.1 <u>Insurance</u>

- A. <u>Insurance Required</u> Contemporaneous with Consultant's execution of this Contract, Consultant shall provide certificates or policies of insurance evidencing at least the minimum insurance overages and limits set forth below as required. For good cause show, Owner may extend the time for submission of the required certificates or policies of insurance upon such terms, and with such assurances of complete and prompt performance, as Owner may impose in the exercise of its sole discretion. Such policies shall be in a form acceptable to Owner and from companies with a general rating of A, and a financial size category of Class V or better, in Best's Insurance Guide and otherwise acceptable to Owner. Such insurance shall provide that no change, modification in, or cancellation of any insurance shall become effective until the expiration of 30 days after written notice thereof shall have been given by the insurance company to Owner.
- B. <u>Minimum Coverages</u> Consultant shall, at all times while providing, performing, or completing the Services, including, without limitation, at all times while correcting any failure to meet representation pursuant to Section 3.2 of this Contract, maintain and keep in force, at Consultant's expense, at least the following minimum insurance coverages and limits:
  - 1. Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability with limits not less than:
    - (a) Worker's Compensation: Statutory;
    - (b) Employer's Liability:
      \$1,000,000 injury-per occurrence
      \$1,000,000 disease-per employee
      \$1,000,000 disease-policy limit

The insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against the member, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers for losses arising from work performed by the Consultant for the Owner.

2. <u>Comprehensive Motor Vehicle Liability</u> with a combined single limit of liability for bodily injury and property damage of not less than \$1,000,000 for vehicles owned, nonowned, or rented. ISO Business Auto Liability coverage from CA0001, Symbol 01 "Any Auto" shall be provided.

All employees shall be included as insureds.

3. <u>Comprehensive General Liability</u> with coverage written on an "occurrence" basis and with a combined single limit of liability for bodily injury and property damage of not less than \$2,000,000. ISO Additional Insured Endorsement CG2010 shall be provided.

#### Coverages shall include:

- Broad Form Property Damage Endorsement
- Blanket Contractual Liability (must expressly cover the indemnity provisions of this Contract)
- Personal Injury
- Bodily injury and property damage
- "X", "C", and "U" exclusions shall be deleted
- 4. <u>Professional Liability Insurance</u> with a limit of liability of not less than \$2,000,000 per claim/annual aggregate, and extended reporting period of not less than three years if coverage is written on a "claims made" basis, and covering Consultant against claims caused by Consultant's negligent act, error or omission in the performance of professional services under this Contract and each Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract. If the policy is written on a claims made form, the retroactive date must be equal to or preceding the effective date of the contract. In the event the policy is cancelled, non-renewed, or switched to an occurrence form, the Consultant shall be required to purchase supplemental extending reporting period coverage for a period of not less than three years. Insurance shall provide indemnification and defense for injury or damage arising out of negligent acts, errors, or omissions in providing the following professional services, but not limited to the following:
  - Preparing, approving, failure to prepare or approve maps, drawings, opinions, reports, surveys, change orders, designs or specifications.
  - Providing direction, instruction, supervision, inspection, engineering services, or failing to provide them, if that is the primary cause of injury or damage.
- 5. <u>Umbrella Policy</u> The required coverages may be in any combination of primary, excess, and umbrella policies. Any excess or umbrella policy must provide excess coverage over underlying insurance on a following-form basis such that when any loss covered by the primary policy exceeds the limits under the primary policy, the excess or umbrella policy becomes effective to cover such loss.

#### C. General Requirements:

- Insurance shall contain a Severability of Interests/Cross liability clause or language stating the Consultant's insurance shall apply separately to each insured whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- The Consultant shall furnish the Owner certificates of insurance naming the Village, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers as additional insureds, except for Workers Compensation and Professional Liability and with original endorsements affecting coverage required by this clause. Certificates and endorsements for each insurance policy shall be signed by

- a person authorized by that insured to buying coverage on its behalf. The additional insured endorsements shall be on Insurance Service Office (ISO) forms: CG201 or CG2026. The Village reserves the right to request fully certified copies of insurance policies and endorsements.
- The Consultant shall include all subcontractors as insureds under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates and endorsements for each subcontractor. All coverages for subcontractors shall be subject to all the requirements state herein.

#### 4.2 Indemnification

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall, without regard to the availability or unavailability of any insurance, either of Owner or Consultant, indemnify, and save harmless Owner against any and all lawsuits, claims demands, damages, liabilities, losses, and expenses, including attorneys' fees and administrative expenses, that may arise out of or in connection with Consultant's negligent acts, errors, or omissions, or failure to perform the Services or any part thereof, except to the extent caused by the negligence of Owner or other third parties.

# ARTICLE V PAYMENT

#### **5.1 Contract Price**

- 1. For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner shall pay to Consultant, in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Article V and in such Task Order, and Consultant shall accept in full satisfaction for providing, performing, and completing the Services, the amount of amounts set forth in such Task Order (the "Contract Price"), subject to any additions, deductions, or withholding provided for in this Contract.
- 2. For all services provided which are not covered by a Task Order, the Consultant shall invoice the Owner on an hourly basis for direct labor to perform the work at a rate set forth in Attachment C. The Owner may request an estimate of fee for approval before work commences. If an estimate is provided, the Consultant shall not exceed the estimated fee without prior approval of the Owner.

#### 5.2 Taxes, Benefits and Royalties

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the Contract Price includes all applicable federal, state, and local taxes of every kind and nature applicable to the Services as well as all taxes, contributions, and premiums for unemployment insurance, old age or retirement benefits, pensions, annuities, or other similar benefits and all costs, royalties, and fees arising from the use on, or the incorporation into, the Services, of patented equipment, materials, supplies, tools, appliances, devices, processes, or inventions. All claim or right to claim additional compensation by reason of the payment of any such tax, contribution, premium, costs, royalties, or fees is hereby waived and released by Consultant.

#### 5.3 **Progress Payments**

- A. <u>Payment In Installments</u> For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the Contract Price shall be paid in monthly installments in the manner set forth in the Task Order for such Project ("Progress Payments").
- B. <u>Pay Requests</u> The Consultants may submit requests for Progress Payments for the services rendered. Payments shall be due and owing by the Owner in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Local Government Prompt Payment Act, Illinois Compiled Statues, Ch.50, Sec.505,et.seq. Notwithstanding other provisions of this Contract, the Consultants may, after giving seven days written notice to the Owner, suspend services under this Contract until

the Consultants have been paid in full all amounts due for services, expenses, and late payment charges.

- C. <u>Invoice Requirements</u> Consultant shall, as a condition precedent to its right to receive each Progress Payment, submit to Owner an invoice accompanied by such receipts, vouchers, and other documents as may be necessary to establish Consultant's prior payment for all labor, material, and other things covered by the invoice and the absence of any interest, whether in the nature of a lien or otherwise, of any party in any property, work, or fund with respect to the Services performed under such Task Order. In addition to the foregoing, such invoice shall include (a) employee classifications, rates per hour, and hours worked by each classification, and, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, for each phase; (b) total amount billed in the current period and total amount billed to date, and, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, for each phase; (c) the estimated percent completion, and if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, for each phase; and (d) Consultant's certification that all prior Progress Payments have been properly applied to the Services with respect to which they were paid. Owner may, by written notice to Consultant, designate a specific day of each month on or before which pay requests must be submitted.
- D. <u>Date of Payment</u> For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall be paid for all Services done in compliance with, as required by or pursuant to, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract up to the day before the pay request, less the aggregate of all previous Progress Payments under such Task Order, no later than 45 days following submission of such pay request; provided, however, that Owner shall not be obligated to make any Progress Payment unless and until Consultant has submitted all required data and documentation to Owner and such documentation and data is complete and in proper form. The person designated by Owner to act as Owner's representative and on Owner's behalf with respect to the Services under such Task Order shall notify Consultant within 14 days following submission of a pay request of any deficiency in the pay request or any dispute as to the amount of the Progress Payment requested; provided, however, that failure to give such notice shall not waive or diminish Owner's rights or remedies under this Contract.

#### 5.4 Final Acceptance and Final Payment

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the Services, or, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, each phase of Services, shall be considered complete on the date of final written acceptance by owner of the Services or each phase of the Services, as the case may be, which acceptance shall not be unreasonably withheld or delays. The Services or each phase of the Services, as the case may be, shall be deemed accepted by Owner if not objected to in writing within 60 days after submission by Consultant of the Services or such phase of Services for final acceptance and payment plus, if applicable, such additional time as may be considered reasonable for obtaining approval of governmental authorities having jurisdiction to approve the Services, or phase of Services, as the case may be. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner

shall pay to Consultant, as soon as practicable after final acceptance, the balance of the Contract Price or, if the Services are to be performed in separate phases, the balance of that portion of the Contract Price with respect to such phase of the Services, after deducting there from all charges against Consultant as provided for in this Contract ("Final Payment"). For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the acceptance by Consultant of Final Payment with respect to the Services or a particular phase of Services under such Task Order, as the case may be, shall operate as a full and complete release of losses, and expenses of, by, or to Consultant for anything done, furnished for, arising out of, relating to, or in connection with the Services or a particular phase of Services under such Task Order, as the case may be, or for or on account of any act or neglect of Owner arising out of, relating to, or in connection with the Services or a particular phase of Services under such Task Order, as the case may be.

#### 5.5 <u>Deductions</u>

- Owner's Right to Withhold Notwithstanding any other provision of this A. Contract and without prejudice to any of Owner's other rights or remedies, for all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Owner shall have the right at any time or times, whether before or after approval of any pay request, to deduct and withhold from any Progress or Final Payment that may be or become due under such Task order such amount as may reasonably appear necessary to compensate Owner for any actual prospective loss due to: (1) Services that are defective, damaged, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, or incomplete; (2) damage for which Consultant is liable under this Contract; (3) liens or claims of lien regardless of merit; (4) claims of subcontractors, suppliers, or other persons regardless of merit; (5) delay in the progress or completion of the Services; (6) inability of Consultant to complete the Services; (7) failure of Consultant to properly complete or document any pay request; (8) any other failure to Consultant to perform any of its obligations under the Task Order for such Project and this Contract; or (9) the cost to Owner, including attorney's fees and administrative costs, or correcting any of the aforesaid matters or exercising any one or more of Owner's remedies set forth in Section 6.1 of this Contract.
- B. <u>Use of Withheld Funds</u> Owner shall be entitled to retain any and all amounts withheld pursuant to Subsection 5.5A above until Consultant shall have either performed the obligations in question or furnished security for such performance satisfactory to Owner. Owner shall be entitled to apply any money withheld or any other money due Consultant under this Contract to reimburse itself for any and all costs, expenses, losses, damages, liabilities, suits, judgments, awards, attorneys' fees, and administrative expenses incurred, suffered, or sustained by Owner and chargeable to Consultant under this Contract.

#### 5.6 Accounting

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall keep accounts, books, and other records of all its billable charges and costs incurred in performing the Services in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices, consistently

applied, and in such manner as to permit verification of all entries. Consultant shall make all such material available for inspection by Owner at all reasonable times during this Contract and for a period of three years following termination of this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract. Copies of such material shall be furnished, at Owner's expense, upon request.

#### ARTICLE VI REMEDIES

#### 6.1 Owner's Remedies

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, if it should appear at any time prior to Final Payment for all work that Consultant has failed or refused to prosecute, or has delays in the prosecution of, the Services with diligence at a rate that assures completion of the Services in full compliance with the requirements of the Task Order for such Project and this Contract, or has attempted to assign the Task Order for such Project or this Contract or Consultant's rights under the Task Order for such Project or this Contract, whether in whole or in part, or has falsely made any representation or warranty in the Task Order for such Project or this Contract, or has otherwise failed, refused, or delays to perform or satisfy any other requirement of the Task Order for such Project or this Contract or has failed to pay its debts as they come due ("Event of Default"), and has failed to cure any such Event of default within five business days after Consultant's receipt of written notice of such Event of Default, then Owner shall have the right, at its election and without prejudice to any other remedies provided by law or equity, to pursue any one or more of the following remedies:

- 1. Owner may require Consultant, within such reasonable time as may be fixed by Owner, to complete or correct all or any part of the Services that are defective, damaged, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, or incomplete; to accelerate all or any part of the Services and to take any or all other action necessary to bring Consultant and the Services into strict compliance with the Task Order for such Project and this Contract.
- 2. Owner may accept the defective, damaged, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, incomplete, or dilatory Services or part thereof and make an equitable reduction in the Contract Price for such Task Order.
- 3. Owner may terminate the Task Order for such Project without liability for further payment of amounts due or to become due under the Task Order for such Project except payment of amounts due or to become due under the Task Order for such Project for all Services done in compliance with, and as required by or pursuant to, the Task Order for such Project and this Contract up to the effective date of termination.
- 4. Owner may withhold from any Progress Payment or Final Payment that may be or become due under such Task Order, whether or not previously approved, or may recover from Consultant, any and all costs, including attorneys' fees and administrative expenses, incurred by Owner as the result of any Event of Default or as a result of actions taken by Owner in response to any Event of Default.
- 5. Owner may recover any damages suffered by Owner as the result of any event of Default.

## 6.2 <u>Terminations and Suspension Deemed for Convenience</u>

Any termination or suspension of Consultant's rights under a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract for an alleged default that is ultimately held unjustified shall automatically be deemed to be a termination or suspension for the convenience of Owner under Section 1.9 of this Contract.

#### ARTICLE VII LEGAL RELATIONSHIPS AND REQUIREMENTS

#### 7.1 **Binding Effect**

This Contract, and all Task Orders issued pursuant to this Contract, shall be binding upon Owner and Consultant and upon their respective heirs, executors, administrators, personal representatives, and permitted successors and assigns. Every reference in this Contract to a party shall also be deemed to be a reference to the authorized officers, employees, agents, and representatives of such party.

#### 7.2 Relationship of the Parties

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall act as an independent contractor in providing and performing the Services. Nothing in, nor done pursuant to, this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract shall be construed (1) to create the relationship of principal and agent, partners, or joint ventures between Owner and Consultant or (2) to create any relationship between Owner and any subcontractor of Consultant.

#### 7.3 No Collusion

Consultant hereby represents and certified that Consultant is not barred from contracting with a unit of state or local government as a result of (i) a delinquency in the payment of any tax administered by the Illinois Department of Revenue unless Consultant is contesting, in accordance with the procedures established by the appropriate revenue Act, its liability for the tax or the amount of the tax, as set forth in 65 ILCS 5/11-42.1-1; or (ii) a violation of either Section 33E-1 et seq. Consultant hereby represents that the only persons, firms, or corporations interested in this Contract as principals are those disclosed to Owner prior to the execution of this Contract, and that this Contract is made without collusion with any other person, firm, or corporation. If at any time it shall be found that Consultant has, in procuring this Contract, colluded with any other person, firm, or corporation, then Consultant shall be liable to Owner for all loss or damage that Owner may suffer thereby, and this Contract shall, at Owner's option, be null and void.

#### 7.4 Assignment

Neither Owner nor Consultant shall (1) assign this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, in whole or in part, (2) assign any of their respective rights or obligations under this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, or (3) assign any payment due or to become due under this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract without the prior express written approval of the other party to this Contract, which approval may be withheld in the sole and unfettered discretion of the party whose approval is required; provided, however, that the other party's prior written approval shall not be required

for assignment of accounts, as defined in the Illinois Commercial Code, if to do so would violate Section 9-318 of the Illinois Commercial Code, 819 ILCS5/9-318.

#### 7.5 <u>Confidential Information</u>

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, all information supplied by Owner to Consultant for or in connection with the Task Order for such Project or the Services under such Task Order shall be held confidential by Consultant and shall not without the prior express written consent of Owner, be used for any purpose other than performance of the Services under such Task Order.

#### 7.6 No Waiver

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, no examination, inspection, investigation, test measurement, review, determination, decision, certificate, or approval by Owner, nor any order by Owner for the payment of money, nor any payment for, or use, occupancy, possession, or acceptance of, the whole or any part of the Services by Owner, nor any extension of time granted by Owner, nor any delay by Owner in exercising any right under the Task Order for such Project or this Contract, nor any other act or omission of Owner shall constitute or be deemed to be an acceptance of any defective, damaged, flawed, unsuitable, nonconforming, or incomplete Services, nor operate to waive or otherwise diminish the effect of any warranty or representation made by Consultant; or of any requirement or provision of the Task Order for such Project or this Contract; or of any remedy, power, or right of Owner.

#### 7.7 **No Third Party Beneficiaries**

No claim as a third party beneficiary under this Contract or under any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract by any person, firm, or corporation other than Consultant shall be made or be valid against Owner.

#### 7.8 Notices

All notices required or permitted to be given under this Contract shall be in writing and shall be deemed received by the addressee thereof when delivered in person on a business day at the address set forth below or on the third business day after being deposited in any main or branch United States post office, for delivery at the address set forth below by properly addressed, postage prepaid, certified or registered mail, return receipt requested.

Notices and communications to Owner shall be addressed to, and delivered at, the following address:

The foregoing shall not be deemed to preclude the use of other non-oral means of notification or to invalidate any notice properly given by any such other non-oral means.

By notice complying with the requirements of this Section 7.8, Owner and Consultant each shall have the right to change the address or addressee or both for all future notices to it, but no notice of a change of address or addressee shall be effective until actually received.

#### 7.9 Governing Laws

This Contract and each Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, and the rights of Owner and Consultant under this Contract and each Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, shall be interpreted according to the internal laws, but not the conflict of laws rules, of the State of Illinois.

#### 7.10 Changes in Laws

Unless otherwise explicitly provided in this Contract or in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, any reference to laws shall include such laws as they may be amended or modified from time to time.

#### 7.11 Compliance with Laws and Grants

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall give all notices, pay all fees, and take all other action that may be necessary to ensure that the Services are provided, performed and completed in accordance with all required governmental permits, licenses, or other approvals and authorizations that may be required in connection with providing, performing and completing the Services, and with all applicable

statues, ordinances, rules, and regulations, including without limitation the Fair Labor Standards Act; any statues regarding qualification to do business any statues prohibiting discrimination because of, or requiring affirmative action based on race, creed, color, national origin, age, sex, or other prohibited classification, including, without limitation, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. 1211010 et seq., and the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall also comply with all conditions of any federal, state, or local grant received by Owner or Consultant with respect to such Project or the Services under the Task Order for such Project.

Consultant shall be solely liable for any fines or civil penalties that are imposed by any governmental or quasi-governmental agency or body that may arise, or be alleged to have arisen, out of or in connection with Consultant's, or its subcontractors', performance of, or failure to perform, the Services under any task order issued pursuant to this Contract or any part thereof.

Every provision of law required by law to be inserted into this Contract or in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract shall be deemed to be inserted herein or therein.

#### 7.12 **Documents**

For all services provided as Water Resources Consultant (as described in 1.1 A. 1.) and each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, drawings, plans, specifications, photos, reports, information, observations, calculations, notes and any other reports, documents, data or information, in any form, prepared, collected, or received by Consultant in connection with any or all of the Services (the "Documents") shall be and remain the property of Owner. At Owner's request, or upon termination of this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the Documents shall be delivered promptly to Owner. Consultant shall maintain files of all Documents unless Owner shall consent in writing to the destruction of the Documents. Consultant shall make, and shall cause all of its subcontractors to make, the Documents available for Owner's review, inspection and audit during the entire term of this Contract and for three years after termination of this Contract or any Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract; provided, however, that prior to the disposal or destruction of the Documents by Consultant or any of its subcontractors following said three year period, Consultant shall give notice to Owner of any Documents to be disposed of or destroyed and the intended date, which shall be at least 90 days after the effective date of such notice of disposal or destruction. Owner shall have 90 days after receipt of any such notice to give notice to Consultant or any of its subcontractors not to dispose of or destroy said Documents and to require Consultant or any of its subcontractors to deliver same to Owner, at Owner's expense.

#### 7.13 Time

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, the Contract Time is of the essence of the Task Order for such Project and this Contract. Except where otherwise stated, references in the Task Order for such Project or this Contract, two days shall be construed to refer to calendar days.

#### 7.14 Severability

The provisions of this Contract and each Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract shall be interpreted when possible to sustain their legality and enforceability as a whole. In the event any provision of this Contract or a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract shall be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction in whole or in part, neither the validity of the remaining part of such provision, nor the validity of any other provisions of this Contract or such Task Order shall be in any way affected thereby.

#### 7.15 Entire Agreement

For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, this Contract and the Task Order for such Project set forth the entire agreement of Owner and Consultant with respect to the accomplishment of the Services under such Task Order and the payment of the Contract Price therefore, and there are no other understandings or agreements, oral or written, between Owner and Consultant with respect to the Services under such Task Order and the compensation therefore.

#### 7.16 Amendments

No modification, addition, deletion, revision, alteration, or other change to this Contract shall be effective unless and until such change is reduced to writing and executed and delivered by Owner and Consultant.

Consultant shall cooperate and work closely with representatives of Owner and other parties involved in each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to the Contract. Consultant shall meet with Owner and such other parties, and shall provide such consultation, advice, and reports, as required to adequately perform its responsibilities under each such Task Order and the Contract. For each Project delineated and described in a Task Order issued pursuant to this Contract, Consultant shall produce and deliver to Owner the results of its Services, plus any reports, documents, data, information, observations, or opinions set forth below that are required to be provided under the Task Order for such Project or requested by Owner, in form or format as set forth below or, if none, in form or format of Owner's choosing.

- 1. <u>Study and Report Phase</u> If Study and Report Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Study and Report Services shall include one or more or all of the following as set forth in the Task Order:
- a. Review available data and consult with Owner to determine a mutually agreed upon program, schedule and preliminary construction budget.
- b. Provide analysis of Owner's needs, planning surveys, and site evaluation and comparative studies of prospective sites and solutions.
  - c. Provide economic analysis of various alternatives.
- d. Prepare, for review and approval by Owner, a report summarizing the Study and Report Services, together with Consultant's Opinion of Probable Project Costs and Construction Cost of the Project and provide 5 copies and review them in person with Owner.
- 2. <u>Preliminary Design Phase</u> If Preliminary Design Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Preliminary Design Services shall include one or more or all of the following as set forth in the Task Order:
  - a. Determine the general scope, extent, and character the Project.
- b. Prepare preliminary design documents of the Project and other documents appropriate for Project.
- c. Furnish 5 copies of the Preliminary Design Documents, together with Consultant's revised Opinion of Probable Project Costs and Construction Cost of the Project, for review and approval by Owner, and review them in person with Owner.

- 3. <u>Final Design Phase</u> If Final Design Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Final Design Services shall include one or more or all of the following set forth in the Task Order:
- a. On basis of accepted Preliminary Design Documents and the revised Opinion of Probable Project Costs and Construction Costs of the Project, prepare pricing and quantity proposal forms, final drawings, and specifications for incorporation in the construction contract documents. Such drawings and specifications shall show the general scope, extent and character of the work to be furnished and performed by the construction contractor.
- b. Assist Owner by providing all required criteria, descriptions and design data and consulting with officials and Owner to obtain permits and to prepare other bidding/negotiation and construction contract documents.
- c. Furnish 5 copies of the proposal forms, drawings, and specifications, together with Consultant's revised Opinion of Probable Project Costs and Construction Costs of the Project, based upon the drawings and specifications and the other bidding/negotiation and construction contract documents, for review and approval by Owner, and review them in person with Owner.
- 4. <u>Bidding or Negotiating Phase</u> If Bidding or Negotiating Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Bidding or Negotiating Services shall include one or more or all of the following as set forth in the Task Order:
- a. Assist Owner in advertising for and obtaining bids or negotiating proposals. Maintain a record of prospective bidders to whom bidding documents have been issued and attend pre-bid or negotiation conferences.
  - b. Issue addenda as appropriate and approved by Owner.
- c. Consult with and advise Owner as to the acceptability of contractors, subcontractors, suppliers and other persons if such acceptability is required by the construction contract documents.
- d. Consult with Owner as to acceptability of proposed substitute materials and equipment.
- e. Attend bid openings, prepare bid or negotiate tabulation sheets, and assist Owner in evaluating bids or proposals and in assembling and awarding construction contracts.
- 5. <u>Construction Phase</u> If Construction Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Construction Services shall include one or more or all of the following services listed below as set forth in the Task Order. The Owner acknowledges that the Consultant in providing these services will act as the Owner's representative with duties, responsibilities and limitations of authority as assigned in the construction contract documents. The Owner also acknowledges that

the Consultant is not responsible for the contractor's means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures, time of performance, compliance with laws and regulations, or safety precautions and programs in connection with the construction project, and the Consultants do not guarantee the performance of the contractor and are not responsible for the contractor's failure to execute the work in accordance with the construction contract documents.

- a. Furnish advice and consulting services during the construction period.
- b. Review, return and comment on shop drawings and other equipment drawings furnished by contractors for materials and equipment to be incorporated into the work. Submittals shall be returned within 30 days of receipt by Consultant.
  - c. Consult and advise on the interpretation of the construction contracts.
- d. Provide a representative to observe the construction of the work on a daily basis; such representative to be acceptable to Owner at all times. On the basis of such observation, Consultant shall recommend the Owner disapprove of or reject construction work while it is in progress if it does not conform to the construction contract or will prejudice the integrity of the design concept.
- e. Assist Owner and field personnel in checking laboratory tests of construction materials and equipment which are to be incorporated into the work.
  - f. Review contractors' breakdown of cost, material quantities and scheduling.
- g. Prepare monthly estimates and certification of construction progress payments, and report to Owner as required to keep Owner informed on the progress of construction and to allow Owner to perform its obligations under the construction contracts.
- h. Prepare and submit proposed change order to Owner for its consideration, approval or denial. Consultant shall, when requested, submit recommendations on proposed change orders.
- i. Maintain daily records of construction, including logs of weather conditions, accident reports, work accomplished, manpower, equipment and materials, and problems encountered.
- j. Schedule and attend preconstruction and job conference and promptly prepare and circulate minutes thereof to all participants.
- k. Maintain files of correspondence, reports of job conferences, field orders, addenda, change orders, shop drawings samples, progress reports, product data, submittals, handbooks, operations and maintenance manuals, instructions and other project-related documents.

- 1. Conduct final inspection of the construction work, and prepare punch lists for corrections and recommend, when the construction work is complete, final payment to the construction contractors.
- m. Prepare and continuously update drawings of record and submit 1 set of reproducible drawings of record and a disk containing electronic copies in a format acceptable to the Owner within 90 days from the completion of the construction contract.
  - n. Limitations of Authority: The Resident Project Representative (RPR) shall not:
    - 1) Authorize any deviation from the Contract Documents of substitution of materials or equipment.
    - 2) Exceed limitations of Engineer's authority as set forth in this Agreement.
    - 3) Undertake any of the responsibilities of Contractor, Subcontractor or Suppliers.
    - 4) Advise on, issue directions relative to, or assume control over any aspect of the means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures of Contractor's work.
    - 5) Advise on, issue directions regarding, or assume control over security or safety practices, precautions, and programs in connection with the activities or operations of Owner or Contractor.
    - 6) Participate in specialized field or laboratory tests of inspections conducted off-site by others except as specifically authorized by Engineer.
    - 7) Accept shop drawing or sample submittals from anyone other than Contractor.
    - 8) Authorize Owner to occupy the project in whole or in part.
- 6. <u>Operational Phase</u> If Operational Services are to be provided under a Task Order, such Operation Services shall include one or more or all of the following as set forth in the Task Order:
- a. Provide assistance in the closing of any financial, refinancing or related transaction for the Project.
- b. Assist Owner in training Owner's personnel to operate and maintain the Project and develop systems and procedures for operation, maintenance and recordkeeping for the Project.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Village currently retains Crawford, Murphy and Tilly, Inc. ("CMT") of Springfield, IL, for airport consulting services. The original master contract between the Village and CMT was approved on March 27, 2014 and is in effect through March 27, 2019. Annually, CMT requests rate increases and Village staff bring these proposed rate increases to the Village Board for consideration. Enclosed is a proposed Ordinance increasing CMT's rates from January 1, 2019 until the end of the current contract, March 27, 2019. CMT has informed Village staff that it charges the same rates to all its clients. In 2019, the average CMT rate increase is 3%. CMT's rates are only used for on-call hourly assignments as Illinois Department of Transportation rates are used for all federally funded grant projects. CMT has served in a consulting capacity for the Airport since 2012. The Public Works Department is satisfied with their performance.

Because the current contract with CMT for airport consulting services is set to expire on March 27, 2019, Village staff began a Request for Qualifications process in 2018. In the coming months, Village staff will bring forth a recommendation for airport consulting services after March 27, 2019.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Village of Lake in the Hills and Cenergy Power, a solar energy company based in Carlsbad, California, entered into a lease option agreement in December 2017 for due diligence engineering and other research necessary for the parties to enter into a twenty-one year lease agreement for the construction and operation of a solar power farm on Lake in the Hills airport property. The term of original agreement was for one year based on the anticipated lead time necessary for Cenergy to obtain all the necessary State and Federal permits and incentives to proceed with the project. This included Cenergy securing necessary incentives through the Illinois Adjustable Block Program, which is the grant funding program for these types of solar projects. While the program was originally scheduled to be released during the summer of 2018, the Illinois Power Agency delayed the release of the initial application block until mid-January of 2019. Cenergy now expects to learn of the results of the incentive program in the Spring of 2019. Due to this delay, Cenergy is requesting a one year extension of the agreement. The terms of the diligence period are identical to what was previously approved by the Board of Trustees, with the exception of the term extension.

The provisions herein are intended to be cumulative and compatible with the terms contained in the core Agreement document. To the extent possible, the terms shall be read to give full effect to both documents. However, in the event any term(s) is considered incompatible, the Addendum shall supersede the core Agreement document:

1. The term of this Agreement shall begin upon its dual execution.

Tenant agrees to indemnify and hold the Village (including its officers, officials, employees or agents) harmless from any and all claims, demands, liability, loss, damages, fines, penalties, attorney's fees and/or legal expenses arising out of any violation(s) and/or injury to person(s) or property, alleged or otherwise, arising out of strict liability and/or to the extent it was caused or alleged to have been caused by the negligent or willful acts or omissions of Tenant (including its officers, officials, employees or agents), arising out of or related to this Agreement or the subject matter of this Agreement. Tenant shall furnish with the Village certificates of insurance naming the Village, its officials, agents, employees, and volunteers as additional insureds, and with original endorsements affecting coverage required by this clause. Certificates and endorsements for each insurance policy shall be signed by a person authorized by that insured to buying coverage on its behalf. The additional insured endorsements will be on Insurance Service Office (ISO) forms: CG 2010 or CG 2026. The Village reserves the right to request fully certified copies of insurance policies and endorsements.

- 2. Tenant shall carry commercial general liability insurance of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$3,000,000 in the aggregate, and Tenant shall name the Village an additional insured under its commercial general liability insurance policy and shall provide the Village proof by way of a certificate of insurance so stating.
- 3. Notice pursuant to the Agreement shall be provided by mail and email as follows:

- 4. Any dispute arising out of or related to the Agreement or the subject matter of the Agreement shall be heard exclusively in the McHenry County Circuit Courthouse for state law claims or the Western Division of the Northern District of Illinois' federal court, with the laws of the State of Illinois to apply to the full extent possible.
- 5. The Agreement may be executed in counterparts, and facsimile/electronic signatures are considered valid and fully enforceable proof of execution.
- 6. The Agreement shall remain valid to the maximum extent permitted by law if any part of the Agreement shall be held invalid for any reason.
- 7. All of Tenant's terms, responsibilities, and duties pertaining to this Agreement are considered material.
- 8. Each Party has had the opportunity to have this Agreement reviewed by an attorney, and any ambiguity in the Agreement shall not be construed in favor of or against either party by nature of which Party drafted it.
- 9. Tenant shall remove its Equipment and all utility lines extended to and through the Leased Premises at the request of the Village from the Leased Premises within thirty (30) days from the expiration or termination of this Agreement or the Lease. Time is of the essence. The Tenant also agrees that the Leased Premises shall be restored, reasonable wear and tear accepted, to their original condition at the beginning of this Agreement by the Tenant except for loss by casualty. In the event that the removal of the Equipment and/or utility lines described above is not completed within such 30-day interval, the Village may, in its sole discretion, remove the Equipment and, in such event, the Tenant shall reimburse the Village for the cost of such removal.
- 10. Tenant shall submit an irrevocable letter of credit in an amount acceptable to the Village to cover the costs of the removal of equipment and restoration of the Leased Premises upon termination of the Agreement or the Lease.
- 11. Tenant shall bear the cost, including but not limited to the fees charged by an architect, attorney, engineer, or other professional assistance when those fees are incurred by the Village regarding any plan submitted to it for review and comment. When the Village deems it necessary to seek outside agencies to review plans, or make inspections, the cost of such review or inspection shall be paid in advance by the Tenant. The total cost of these fees to the Tenant shall not exceed \$50,000.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The applicant, Randall Algonquin Plaza, LLC, requests multiple variations to the Zoning Ordinance to ensure the property located at 100 through 212 N Randall Road complies with the Zoning Ordinance following transfer of portions of the property to support the Randall Road Improvement project. This action is similar to the variations granted on 23 other properties along Randall Road in February 2018. The variations include:

- Table 8.4 to reduce the front yard building setback from fourteen feet to zero feet along Algonquin Road.
- Table 16.11 to reduce the sign setback from ten feet to zero feet along Algonquin Road.
- Table 16.11 to increase the maximum sign height from sixteen feet to twenty-three feet along Algonquin Road.
- Section 18.6-2 to reduce the front yard parking setbacks from eight feet to zero along Algonquin Road and Randall Road.
- Section 26.5 to reduce the front yard landscaping setback from thirty feet to zero and eliminate landscaping requirements along Algonquin Road and Randall Road.
- Section 26.6 to reduce the side yard landscaping setback from ten feet to zero and eliminate landscaping requirements along the north and west side lot lines.

The front yard building, parking, and landscaping setbacks are directly attributed to the loss of property to be converted to right-of-way for the Randall Road Improvement project.

The sign setback is also required due to this loss of property. Because the sign must be relocated into the existing parking lot, the applicant also requested a variation to the height of the sign. The sign will remain the same size but will be elevated eight feet to make it visible above parked vehicles. The top of the new sign would be 23 feet, which would be similar to the U-Haul / At Home sign across Randall Road.

The two side yard landscaping setbacks are necessary to bring the parcel into compliance. They were constructed with no setback, but are no longer in compliance as they exist.

The Planning and Zoning Commission conducted a public hearing on December 11, 2018. There were no public comments on the proposed actions. The Commission recommended approval by a vote of 5-0.

#### **Background**

The applicants are requesting variations to the Zoning Ordinance to bring the lot into compliance with the Zoning Ordinance following the conversion of parts of the parcel to ROW to support the Randall Road Improvement project. Requests include reductions of building setbacks, landscaping setbacks, and parking setbacks created due to the location of the new ROW limits. Additionally, reduction of the side yard setbacks on the west and north lot lines are necessary to correct a zoning deficiency existing since the original construction in the mid-90s.

The sign must be relocated also due to the new ROW limits. This will force the sign to be relocated to an island in the parking lot. In addition to the sign setback reduction, the maximum height of the sign will have to be increased to 23 feet so the lowest lettered portions are visible over the vehicles parked in the lot. The proposed sign is no larger than the current sign, but will be raised eight feet.

All of the proposed variations, except the landscape setbacks on the west and north lot lines, were created by the Randall Road Improvement project. The development was approved in 1994 as a Planned Unit Development. In 2002, variations were granted for building, parking, and sign setbacks when Algonquin Road was improved by McHenry County. The Village Board granted similar variations in early 2018 for 23 other properties affected by the Randall Road Improvement project.

#### Standards and Findings of Fact for a Variation

The Planning and Zoning Commission may recommend and the Board of Trustees shall permit a variation of the provisions of this Zoning Code, as authorized in this Section, only if the evidence, in the judgement of the Village sustains each of the following three conditions:

# A. The property in question cannot yield a reasonable return if permitted to be used only under the conditions allowed by the regulations governing the district in which it is located;

The applicants indicate the variations are consistent with nearby commercial properties and necessary due the widening of Randall and Algonquin Roads.

#### B. The plight of the owner is due to unique circumstances; and

The applicants indicate that the variations are required due to the widening of Randall and Algonquin Roads by McHenry County.

#### C. The variation, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the locality.

The applicants indicate this will not alter the essential character of the locality.

For the purpose of supplementing the above standards, the Village, in making this determination whenever there are practical difficulties or particular hardship, also shall take into consideration the extent to which the following facts, favorable to the applicant, have been established by the evidence:

D. That the particular physical surroundings, shape or topographical conditions of the specific property involved would bring a particular hardship upon the owner as distinguished from a mere inconvenience if the strict letter of the regulation were to be carried out;

The applicants indicate that the variations are required due to the widening of Randall and Algonquin Roads by McHenry County.

E. That the conditions upon which the petition for variation is based would not be applicable generally to other property within the same zoning classification;

The applicants indicate this is consistent with variations granted to the other properties in the area due to the Randall Road Improvement project.

F. That the purpose of the variation is not based exclusively upon a desire to make more money out of the property;

The applicants indicate that the variations are required due to the widening of Randall and Algonquin Roads by McHenry County.

G. That the alleged difficulty or hardship has not been created by any person presently having interest in the property;

The applicants indicate that the variations are required due to the widening of Randall and Algonquin Roads by McHenry County.

H. That the granting of the variation will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to other property or improvements in the neighborhood in which the property is located; or

The applicants indicate it will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to other property or improvements in the neighborhood in which the property is located.

I. That the proposed variation will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, or substantially increase the danger of fire, or otherwise endanger the public safety, or substantially diminish or impair property values within the neighborhood.



#### **ORDINANCE NO. 1994-95-9**

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An Ordinance Zoning and Issuing a Special Use Permit for a Planned Development for Certain Property Known as the G & H Development

WHEREAS, the Village of Lake in the Hills has been requested in a petition filed by Harris Bank of Barrington, not personally but as Trustee under Trust Agreement dated June 1, 1988 and known as Trust No. 11-4030, to have certain territory (the "Subject Property") rezoned from RA-1, Agriculture Zoning District, to B-3 Business District, General Business, and issued a special use permit for a planned development; and

WHEREAS, the Subject Property is described as follows:

That part of the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 30, Township 43 north, Range 8 east of the Third Principal Meridian, described as follows: beginning at a point on the west right of way line of Randall Road, said point being 1980.02 feet south of the north line of the Northeast Quarter of Section 30; thence continuing south along the west line of Randall Road a distance of 557.65 feet; thence southwesterly a distance of 49.28 feet along a line which forms a counterclockwise angle of 124 degrees 43 minutes 46 seconds with the last described line; thence westerly a distance of 110.98 feet along a line which forms a counterclockwise angle of 153 degrees 18 minutes 02 seconds with the last described line, to the north right of way line of Huntley-Algonquin Road, said right of way line being 40.00 feet north of the centerline of said road; thence westerly along said north line of Huntley-Algonquin Road a distance of 352.66 feet, said line forming a counterclockwise angle of 171 degrees 37 minutes 20 seconds with the last described line; thence northerly a distance of 599.11 feet along a line which forms a counterclockwise angle of 90 degrees 20 minutes 51 seconds with the last described line; thence easterly a distance of 502.99 feet along a line which forms an angle of 90 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds with the last described line, to the place of beginning, in McHenry County, Illinois.

Said property consists of 7± acres located at the northwest corner of Algonquin and Randall roads; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the Lake in the Hills Zoning Board of Appeals, after due notice in the manner provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals, after deliberation, has

made a report and recommended the granting of said zoning and the issuing of a special use permit for a planned unit development to allow the development of the Subject Property as a commercial shopping center; and

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WHEREAS, the Village Board has considered the findings of fact, based upon the evidence presented at the public hearing and the evidence presented to the Zoning Board of Appeals, by the petitioner; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the Village of Lake in the Hills that such zoning classification be granted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the VILLAGE OF LAKE IN THE HILLS, McHenry County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: The zoning classification of B-3, Business District, General Business, with a Special Use Permit as a Planned Development, shall be granted for the Subject Property.

SECTION 2: That the rezoning and issuance of the Special Use Permit is conditioned on the following:

- A. With regard to any auto repair facilities, no parking shall be permitted outdoors overnight.
- B. The property shall be built out in accordance with the four page plan prepared by Kaplan Mangurten Architects, covering site, landscape, elevations and signs, entitled "Proposed Retail Development" dated 3-15-94 and revised, 1994.
- C. Signs: Ground signs, which shall not exceed two nor be more than 15 feet in height, shall be as depicted in the plan referenced in "B" above.
- D. Parking stalls shall be not less than nine feet in width.
- E. Refuse and utilities shall be enclosed and enclosures shall be of the same material as the building exterior.

SECTION 3: The Subject Property may only be utilized in accordance with the terms of this Ordinance. The corporate authorities of the Village would not have zoned the Subject Property as set forth herein, except for the fact that the property was to be permanently impressed with the specific provisions contained herein. In the event that the owner of the property granted the zoning classification, including the Special Use Permit herein, should desire to utilize the property for some use other than that herein granted, an application must be made to the Village for modification in the zoning category or Special Use

Permit granted.

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SECTION 4: The Village Clerk shall note the zoning category granted herein upon the zoning map of the Village.

The Findings of Fact of the Zoning Board of SECTION 5: Appeals are hereby accepted.

SECTION 6: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, sentence or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, invalidate or nullify the remainder thereof, which remainder shall remain and continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 7: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 8: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form (which publication is hereby authorized) as provided by law.

## ORDINANCE 2002-03-67

An Ordinance Granting Variations for the Property Commonly Known as 100 N. Randall Road (Walgreens)

WHEREAS, Amalgamated Trust & Savings Bank, as Trustee of Trust Number 5608, owner of the property legally described in Exhibit A ("Subject Property"), and the McHenry County Highway Department, co-applicant, petitioned the Village of Lake in the Hills for a variation from Section 8.4 of the Lake in the Hills Zoning Ordinance to reduce the side yard abutting a street from 30 feet to 14 feet for the building and from 30 feet to 8 feet for the parking lot and a variance to Section 16.11 of the Zoning Ordinance to reduce the setback for a ground sign from 10 feet to 0 feet for the Subject Property commonly known as 100 N. Randall Road; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the Village of Lake in the Hills Planning and Zoning Commission, after due notice in the manner provided by law; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission, after deliberation, has made a report and made its recommendation relative to the granting of said variations for the Subject Property; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have considered the findings of fact, based upon the evidence presented by the petitioner at the public hearing before the Lake in the Hills Planning and Zoning Commission.

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that the property in question cannot yield a reasonable return if permitted to be used only under the conditions allowed by the regulations governing the district in which it is located; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that the plight of the owner is due to unique circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that the variations will not alter the essential character of the locality; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that that the particular physical surroundings, shape or topographical conditions of the specific property involved would bring a particular hardship upon the owner as distinguished from a mere inconvenience if the strict letter of the regulation were

to be carried out; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that the conditions upon which the petition for the variations are based would not be applicable generally to other property within the same zoning classification; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that the purpose of the variations are not based exclusively upon a desire to make more money out of the property; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that the alleged difficulty or hardship has not been created by any person presently having interest in the property; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that the granting of the variations will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to other property or improvements in the neighborhood in which the property is located; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that the proposed variations will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, or substantially increase the danger of fire, or otherwise endanger the public safety, or substantially diminish or impair property values within the neighborhood.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the VILLAGE OF LAKE IN THE HILLS, McHenry County, Illinois that:

SECTION 1: The Corporate Authorities find that the statements in the foregoing preamble are true.

SECTION 2: The findings and recommendations of the Planning and Zoning Commission on the question of granting variations to the Zoning Ordinance on the Subject Property are hereby accepted.

SECTION 3: A variation from Section 8.4 of the Zoning Ordinance to reduce the side yard abutting a street (Algonquin Road) from 30 feet to 14 feet for the building and from 30 feet to 8 feet for the parking lot as depicted on Exhibit B is hereby approved for the Subject Property.

SECTION 4: A variation from Section 16.11 of the Zoning Ordinance to reduce the setback for a ground sign along Algonquin Road from 10 feet to 0 feet as depicted on Exhibit B is hereby approved for the Subject Property.

SECTION 5: The variances granted in Sections 3 and 4 do not take effect until after the additional right-of-way along Algonquin Road is purchased by McHenry County.

SECTION 6: All other requirements set forth in the Zoning Ordinance of the Village of Lake in the Hills as would be required by the Village as to any owner of property zoned in the same manner as the Subject Property shall be complied with.

SECTION 7: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, sentence or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, invalidate or nullify the remainder thereof, which remainder shall and continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 8: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 9: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by a two-thirds vote of the Corporate Authorities. Publication in pamphlet form is hereby authorized as provided by law.




