VILLAGE OF LAKE IN THE HILLS PARKS & RECREATION BOARD MEETING

December 6, 2018

The Parks & Recreation Board meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. at the Lake in the Hills Village Hall. Those present were Members Andrea, Cairns, Lupo, Wackerlin, and Chairwoman Tredore. Also present were Director of Community Services Fred Mullard, Assistant Director of Parks & Recreation Megan Croy, Recreation Supervisor Kristi Brewer, Trustee Suzanne Artinghelli, and Recording Secretary Laura Pekovic. Member Sandage was absent.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS--None

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion to approve the minutes of the Parks & Recreation Board meeting of November 1, 2018 was made by Member Lupo and seconded by Member Wackerlin. The motion was approved by a vote of 5-0.

OLD BUSINESS – Goals

Pursuant to the vision on how staff can enhance and improve services within the community, there was an active discussion among Board members and staff regarding the safety of the parks programs and equipment, as well as the uniqueness of Lake in the Hills.

Regarding the "Safe" vision of Lake in the Hills, comments from the Board were that the parks and playgrounds are well maintained, equipped with appropriate warning signs, and a Thoroguard lightening alert system at Sunset Park. It is important that events need to be safe for all with clear exits. Director Mullard explained that there are certified playground inspectors at Public Works who do monthly inspections. They are able to do some immediate repairs or will take a playground piece out of service until a replacement can be installed. Public Works and the Algonquin/Lake in the Hills Fire Department also conduct regular, Village-facility inspections.

In response to a member inquiry, Parks staff described Village safety plans currently in place when hosting programs with children and seniors. Background checks are conducted of all employees who work with children and seniors. Records are safely secured in accordance with DCFS guidelines. Employees receive first aid, driver-safety, and food safety training/certification. Parks and Recreation staff works with the Police Department for event weather-related emergency plans.

Regarding the "Uniquely Lake in the Hills" vision, comments from the Board were that Lake in the Hills has the uniqueness of both open space and water. The airport and fen are also unique. In order to create more of an identity to Lake in the Hills it is important to select programs around these places and advertise as such. The Turtle Island Improvement Project is a good example of this.

Megan Croy reviewed the staff report. The Beyond the Bell program needs staff. Finding a supervisor that has the required skill set has been a challenge. For now, Kristi Brewer has been stepping up to that role in addition to her regular duties. The Letters to Santa program is going well with personalized, handwritten letters being written by the Senior Club members. The Customer Service Division/employee relocation was explained. The former Parks and Recreation office staff area is proposed to be new preschool rooms to replace the Indian Trail Beach location, pending 2019 budget approval.



Safety Standards & Guidelines - Reference Information

The Konnection Swing was designed to provide an intergenerational play opportunity and offer everyone the childhood joy of swinging! While researching the use of swings, two trends stood out to us - caregivers pushing infants in bucket seat swings and adults swinging with children on their lap. Both situations could be improved with the design of a swing designed to foster connection and increase safety. The Konnection Swing was developed as a direct result of this. The overall design is focused on fostering true connection in both eye contact and proximity leading to increased engagement for all users. Hands-free swinging allows the caregiver to hold, interact and play with the child as they both experience the thrill of swinging together.

The Konnection Swing is IPEMA Certified and meets or exceeds the requirements of ASTM F1487-17, which is recognized as the standard of care in the playground industry. This ASTM public playground safety standard is revised every two to three years to remain current with innovation and market trends.

The CPSC Public Playground Safety Handbook hasn't been revised since 2008 and doesn't include new product categories that have been innovated in recent years. There are a couple of points to note when deciding to purchase a multi-user swing:

- Multi-user swings are innovative and CPSC Public Playground Safety Handbook doesn't have a standard that specifically covers them.
- CPSC 5.3.8.3.1 CPSC recommends that belt swing seats should be designed to
 accommodate no more than one user at any time. While the Konnection Swing is a single axis
 swing, it is clearly not a belt seat.
- CPSC 2.3.1 CPSC says that swings intended for more than one user are not recommended because their greater mass, as compared to single occupancy swings, presents a risk of impact injury.
 - The ASTM safety standard, F1487, was revised in 2011 to add maximum impact requirements for swings and the Konnection Swing has been tested and is compliant with ASTM impact requirements.
 - CPSC has written a letter stating that "the swing impact test in F1487-11 is a reasonable approach to address the concerns posed by unoccupied, heavy, multiple occupancy swings."
- CPSC has always included an exemption to both recommendations listed above for tire swings, which are multiple occupancy swings that are suspended from a single pivot and permit swinging in any direction.
- CPSC also emphasizes that their Handbook provides recommendations, not requirements. If a
 jurisdiction adopts the Handbook's recommendations as mandatory requirements, that
 jurisdiction would need to determine how the requirements should be applied in any particular
 instance.

Parks Project Status -

The ice rink at Sunset Park was opened to the public on January 25. Details on closures are located on the Village's website.

The LaBuy Playground Request for Simplified Proposal ended on January 31. Vendors are invited to attend a February 7 resident focus group on February 7 at 6 p.m. to assist in selection of three vendors to submit a final proposal.

Plote Field lighting improvements and scorboard installation will take place mid-March as the weather becomes more conducive to truck traffic.

The Turtle Island project is still in consideration for the OSLAD grant. We expect to receive a response within the next month.

Recreation Project Status -

Preschool Academy returning family registration began on Friday, February 1. So far twelve students have registered and many calls and messages are being received. New students can register starting February 15.

Preschool Academy classes and the Beyond the Bell after school program were closed on Monday, January 8 and Wednesday January 30 through Friday, February 1 due to inclement weather. Participants are notified by email of program cancelations. All cancellations were also posted on Facebook.

230 Bark Park memberships have already been purchased for 2019.

The Ice Fishing Tournament was held on Saturday, February 2. Approximately 60 participants attended and enjoyed their time fishing. Snacks were provided and all participants were put into a drawing for door prizes. Trophies were given to the angler catching the biggest, smallest, and most fish.

Staff is beginning to plan for changes to the former parks and Recreation office space that will be transformed into two preschool classrooms for the 2019-2020 school year.

We are currently interviewing candidates for the open Recreation Coordinator position. We hope to complete the process and fill the position by mid-February.







Q1 Please indicate how many people in each age group are represented in your household.








