


VIP & ME

LAW ENFORCEMENT EXPLORERS

The Lake in the Hills Police Explorer Post #1096 is comprised of an award-winning team. Law Enforcement Exploring is a nationwide program which provides young men and women ages 14 through 20 with the opportunity to "explore" a career in law enforcement while also following the Exploring guidelines set forth by the Boy Scouts of America. Post #1096 was started in October 1999. It is funded by donations from area businesses and fundraising is conducted by the Explorers with guidance from advisors and police department staff.

In 2019, Post #1096 was proudly recognized as Explorer Post of the Year at the Illinois Law Enforcement Explorer Conference. The conference unites Explorer teams from across the state to compete in a variety of different scenarios including: hostage negotiation, felony



suspect arrest, building search, tactic emergency medical care, and more. The Post receives weekly instruction, as well as hands-on experience from officers in various areas of leadership. The team also learns through observance during ridealongs with the patrol division. The Post also assists the police department by volunteering at many community events and assisting with security and traffic control. The program promotes personal growth through character development, respect for the rule of law, physical fitness, good citizenship and patriotism. Members wear a police-style uniform bearing the department's patch and an explorer post patch.

ONLINE TRANSACTION SAFEZONE

Did you know the police station is available as an online transaction safezone? It serves as a safe location to complete transactions without providing personal information, such as a home address, to unknown persons. While items cannot be stored at the police department or in the parking lot, if the item can be safely transported we encourage sellers to consider conducting the transaction in our transaction safezone. Residents or business owners selling or buying items on Facebook marketplace or other online sites may meet buyers/sellers in the parking lot or lobby areas of the police department. The parking lot and lobby areas are monitored by staff and security cameras 24 hours a day and are well-lit in the evening. We recommend calling our non-emergency line (847-658-5676) to advise of the transaction date and time so we are aware.

Here are additional tips for conducting a transaction with an unknown buyer:

- Only accept cash or a cashier's check for sale. Personal checks carry some risk.
- Conduct sales during weekdays so banking or financial institutions can be contacted if there is a problem.
- Don't go alone and trust your instincts.

POLICE STATION TOURS

The Lake in the Hills Police Department encourages schools, education centers and civic groups to arrange for a tour of the police station. Tours are offered with the goal of educating the public about police operations. Tours are generally 30 minutes in length. Tours can include a safety talk upon request. All tours must be booked a minimum of three weeks in advance. We ask that tour groups be limited to 20 individuals at a time. Police stations are a dynamic work environment, and tours may need to be canceled or postponed and some areas may be omitted from the tour due to situational circumstances. CAR SEAT INSPECTIONS

Children deserve the best protection while riding in a vehicle and the best way to keep a child safe in the car is to use the right car seat in the right way. We provide child safety seat inspections by certified child safety seat technicians to ensure that your child is in the appropriate child safety seat and that it is installed properly in your vehicle. CHILD IDENTIFICATION CARDS

Child Identification Cards are a service offered by the Lake in the Hills Police Department which provides a photo identification card for children.

Parents or guardians can carry the child identification card in their purse or wallet, keep it in a safe place, or secure it onto the bottom of the child's car seat. The



child identification card includes a photo of the child, personal information and emergency contact/medical information.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

Neighborhood Watch is a national program which encourages residents to establish a group "watch" in their neighborhood to have heightened awareness for crime detection and deterrence. TRI-AREA COURT FOR TEENS (TACT)

You can take a stand against juvenile crime – get involved in teen court as a volunteer juror! Teen Court jurors are provided an opportunity to get involved in juvenile justice and realize their duties as members of the community. Teen Court is a program which allows a first-time teenage offender an opportunity to have his/her case heard by a jury of peers instead of going to the traditional court. In Teen Court, teenage offenders are given the opportunity to accept responsibility for their criminal behavior. By agreeing to have peers determine what the "sentence" or penalty should be, the offense will not go on the offender's record. First-time offenders who appear as defendants before their peers in

SPEED TRAILER

The speed trailer is used to educate drivers of their speed. It is placed in various locations throughout the village where speeding problems and complaints have been received. The speed trailer is equipped with a radar gun and a computer that records vehicle speed, the number of vehicles, and the time of day. It also allows us to conduct traffic studies to determine if any changes are needed on a street and to schedule various types of traffic enforcement in the area.

The Lake in the Hills Police Department encourages residents to contact the department with comments or complaints regarding traffic violations in the community. To submit a traffic complaint, complete the online form at www.lith.org/police and your comments will be submitted to the Traffic Unit Supervisor. You can also report concerns to the Traffic Unit Supervisor at 847-658-5676.

OPERATION TRAFFIC WATCH

Operation Traffic Watch is a community-based program designed to create a partnership between the residents of Lake in the Hills and the police department in addressing neighborhood traffic issues within the community. Applicants must be over the age of 21, a resident of the village, and must complete a two-hour mandatory training at the police department covering traffic law and the operation of speed detection devices. Applicants won't have direct contact with traffic violators but will be required to document the date and time along with the violation that was observed. Such violations in the past have included the following: speeding, disobeying a stop sign, and stop arm violations. For further information, contact the police department at 847-658-5676.

OVERNIGHT PARKING AND VACATION HOUSE WATCH REQUESTS

Overnight parking and vacation house watch requests are processed through our online portal powered by Frontline Public Safety Solutions. The information submitted using the portal is safety and securely transmitted to the Lake in the Hills Police Department from this server. Visit our request portal at https://www.frontlinepss.com/lakeinthehills

VACATION HOUSE WATCHES

House watch requests that extend beyond two (2) weeks will only be checked once a week unless there are special circumstances and the request is approved by the Shift Commander.

OVERNIGHT PARKING

- You must register any vehicles that will be parked on the street during the prohibited parking times from 2:00 am 6:00 am.
- Each residential address is limited to five (5) parking requests per calendar month.
- Overnight parking is prohibited when there is one (1) inch or more of snowfall on the roadways.
- It is always illegal to park over the sidewalk at any time of the day or night.

ANONYMOUS CRIME TIPPING

If it is an emergency, call 911 immediately! You can be anonymous on 911. The Lake in the Hills Police Department wants to ensure that all the neighborhoods in the village are safe for our citizens. While we work to do this through proactive patrol and police presence, we sometimes need help. As a citizen of our community you often see things that we don't, and you know your neighborhood best. We encourage you to use this page to advise us of criminal or suspicious activity that you observe. Should you see something, say something. We implore all of our citizens to help us make Lake in the Hills as safe as we can.

- Dogs must have a handler over the age of 18 present at all times.

- There is a limit of two (2) dogs per person (or handler).

Registration forms are processed on a first-come, firstserved basis starting on the dates listed. To register for a class you must complete a registration form. One family per registration form only. Add all fees and include one check for the total amount for all program(s). **Payment must be included with registration.** Fees must be paid by check if mailed. **DO NOT SEND CASH!** Make checks payable to: Village of Lake in the Hills. The Village is not responsible for late or lost mail.

WHICH PROGRAMS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR ONLINE REGISTRATION?

You may register for most programs listed in our activity guide. **Races are online registration ONLY.** Lake use permits, boat stickers, and Bark Park memberships are **NOT** processed online.

COURSE CONFIRMATION

Walk-in and mail-in registrations will receive receipt confirmation via email. Staff will notify you if any issues arise in your registration or the program. Otherwise, please assume that you are enrolled in the class of your choice and refer to your receipt for dates, times, and class locations.

RETURNED CHECK POLICY

If, for any reason, a check is returned to our office marked "NSF" we will contact you. You will then be required to submit a full cash payment, as well as a \$25 bookkeeping fee. Class privileges will be suspended and new registration will not be accepted until payment in full is received.

SATISFACTION GUARANTEED

The Village of Lake in the Hills is always striving to provide high-quality activities and guarantees you will be satisfied with the recreation classes, programs, and services in which you participate. If for any reason you are not satisfied, tell us and we will quickly arrange for you to choose one of the following options:

1. Repeat the class at no charge (if openings are available).

2. Provide a refund for the program (see below).

CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY

All requests for program cancellations must be made in writing. A Cancellation Request Form must be used and can be found on our website www.lith.org or at Village Hall. A \$5 service fee per household will be charged for any cancellation request. (Please note: camp, preschool and Beyond the Bell refund policies are specific to their program.)

- 1. A full refund will be issued for any activity that is canceled by the Village. No written refund request is required.
- 2. A refund will not be issued for special events, activities which require a registration fee, or a trip seat that cannot be filled.

- 3. Refunds are based on the following:
 - a. A refund (less \$5 service fee) if cancellation request is received prior to the start of program.
 - b. A prorated refund (less \$5 service fee) or transfer into another program if cancellation is made prior to the second class.
 - c. After the second class, refunds cannot be issued. A prorated transfer to a current published brochure program can be completed during this time.
 - d. Once a cancellation request has been received, only remaining classes will be considered towards the prorated transfer.
 - e. The exception for a refund fee is for a medical doctor's note, filling a trip spot, at the discretion of the Village.
- 4. Make up classes would either have a rescheduled date or refund. Any person not able to attend the rescheduled date must contact customer service for a refund.

The Village of Lake in the Hills reserves the right to cancel, postpone, or combine classes for any reason found to be necessary by the staff.
