### Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:31 pm. Roll Call was answered by Members Wackerlin, Cairns, Sivakumar, Donahue, Carmen, and Vice-Chairman Andrea. Chairwoman Tredore was absent.

Also present were, Public Works Director Tom Migatz, Superintendent of Public Properties Scott Parchutz, Recreation Superintendent Kim Buscemi, Recreation Supervisor Kristi Brewer, Trustee Wendy Anderson, Assistant Village Administrator Shannon Andrews, and Recording Secretary Dana Popovich.

# Approval of Meeting Minutes

Motion to accept the Parks and Recreation meeting minutes of December 2, 2022 was made by Member Cairns and seconded by Member Carmen. On roll call vote, Members Wackerlin, Cairns, Sivakumar, Donahue, Carmen and Vice-Chairman Andrea voted Aye. No Nays. Motion carried.

### **New Business**

### A. 2021 Year End Review-Program Statistics

Superintendent Parchutz reviewed the year-end financial and program statistics for 2021. Highlights included Facility Rental Revenue of \$29,527.50, Park Shelter Rental Revenue of \$7,390.00, Bark Park Revenue of \$33,433.00, Lake and Boat Revenue of \$10,692.00, and Community Garden Revenue of \$810.00. The gross income from rental and permit revenue is \$81,852.50.

### B. Lynn Dillow Playground Replacement

Assistant Village Administrator Andrews started the discussion about the Lynn Dillow playground replacement and went through where staff was coming from. She said it stemmed from the discussion about the Larson Park planning and the Boards wanting an inclusive park. At that time, the Board expressed concern that while this has been an interest and priority for many years, the necessary funding had not been made available. Assistant Village Administrator Andrews stated that funding has been incorporated in the 2022 Fiscal Budget. She also stated that the Larson Park Project has not been ruled out as an all-inclusive park, but that we also have other opportunities that should be looked at.

One of the reasons Lynn Dillow is being considered is that the features are conducive for that kind of park. There is parking and handicap parking available and walkways to both the playground and basketball courts. There would be some work that would need to be done on the surface of the playground to ensure access to all the playground equipment, but this park does seem to meet the criteria to be considered for an inclusive park. We have requested an additional \$60,000 dollars in funds from the Village Board in order to move forward and at least explore the possibility. The Village Board supported that request and we have \$223,000 for this playground replacement. How we utilize that still has to be determined. Step one in helping us identify in how to move forward was to go through the process of conducting a survey. There were a couple of things that stood out, first was that there were two individuals that have a person in their home that would require special accommodations for them to use the park. Fifty-nine residents provided ideas on how to improve the parks. Nineteen volunteered to be in a focus group for inclusive park designs. If we are going to move forward with trying to incorporate inclusive design in any of our parks, we really need to have a team of people in the community that have more knowledge and experience on

how to design an inclusive play space for the kids. We are hoping to have more information at the February meeting. The purpose of the discussion is to determine how the Parks and Recreation Board would like to move forward with the equipment replacement at Lynn Dillow Park.

Assistant Administrator Andrews opened the discussion to the Board to get their feedback. Member Carmen stated that she would really like to see an inclusive park. She also added that people are willing to travel to this kind of park. This would be good for our town and our economy. Member Sivakumar agreed with Member Carmen. Member Donahue agrees and added that we should be looking at any park we are replacing equipment to include some inclusive features. She believes that this is going to be the future of park development. She also would like there to be a list of each park and there amenities so one can easily identify which park offers the features they would want. Assistant Administrator Andrews commented that our designers have been working very hard to make sure our web sight has very detailed information about each park. Member Wackerlin thinks we should focus on making two parks all-inclusive, one on the east side and one on the west, instead of having one or two features at every park. Member Carmen spoke to that in saying that we really need to have some inclusive activities at each park. Trustee Anderson thinks we should really focus on Lynn Dillow and see if we could make it a fully inclusive park, not just a patchwork park.

Assistant Administrator Andrews stated that the budget of \$223,000 may not be enough to make it a true allinclusive park. She stated that we are going to have to change the footprint of the park. Also, what kind of equipment would be needed and whether that \$223,000 is going to be sufficient, we don't know yet. Tonight, we need to figure out if Lynn Dillow could be an inclusive park. The survey did show that we do have a couple families that would require special accommodations to utilize the park. She would like the Board to decide if not just for the couple of families in the survey, but for others who could benefit from this kind of park. Is Lynn Dillow that park? That may not be fully answered at this moment, but this is our opportunity at the moment. Member Donahue stated do we really need just inclusive features or an inclusive park and whether it is at Lynn Dillow or do other parks need to be explored. More research needs to be completed. Vice-Chairman Andrea stated he is in support of exploring Lynn Dillow since the funds have already been approved. Assistant Administrator Andrews stated that if we move forward and find that the funds are not enough we would have to go the Village Board and request additional funds. Member Wackerlin says that the question is being asked of us to decide if Lynn Dillow is the right park to consider all-inclusive. He feels it is too hidden and not off any main roads. He feels if he had to make a choice between Lynn Dillow or Larson, he would rather Larson be all-inclusive. He encourages the Board members to take a look at Lynn Dillow before making any decisions. Member Wackerlin thinks that maybe some inclusive features could be added at Lynn Dillow, but does not feel it should be the all-inclusive park.

Vice-Chairman Andrea speaks to that and thinks it is too soon to make any decisions without seeing a masterplan. He agrees with Member Wackerlin about including some inclusive features at Lynn Dillow, just not all-inclusive.

Member Sivakumar agrees with Member Wackerlin that Lynn Dillow is not a conducive location for an all-inclusive park, some elements yes, but no all-inclusive. Trustee Anderson stated that the Board should be focusing on the area, Lynn Dillow is in the middle of a huge residential area. That is something to keep in mind.

Assistant Administrator Andrews summarizes that there is vast support for considering inclusive play and adding inclusive features at Lynn Dillow, but having it be the essential all-inclusive park is where there is a difference of opinion.

Assistant Administrator Andrews stated that she agrees with Trustee Anderson. The response from the survey indicated that either 20 people or 20% of the people that visit the park, drive to the park. That is why there is a parking lot and the ability for the population to have access to the park. Assistant Administrator Andrews also

stated that there are going to be limitations on availability and timing of when these opportunities come up. We can identify in part of the master park planning process which park might be best for an all-inclusive park, but it may be years before that happens. There needs to be an understanding that how we proceed with this could be impactful. It may or may not happen with Larson, and we do not want to miss the opportunity at Lynn Dillow.

Member Donahue spoke about the frog at Lynn Dillow, and requested that we do not remove it as the residents requested. Assistant Administrator Andrews agreed with that.

# Staff Report

Superintendent Buscemi reviewed her staff report which included the upcoming events for January and February. Also, asking if anyone would like to volunteer for any of the events to let her know. She highlighted some of the events that took place in December. This included tree decorating at the Algonquin Library with the Beyond the Bell Afterschool Program. There was a Funtastic Camp over the holiday break. There was a house decorating contest. The Holiday Lights Bus Tour was sold out for each of the three nights. The adult seniors took a trip in early December to Naperville for a holiday trolley ride and dinner at Francesca's. She also talked about the adult dropin activities.

Pre- School was back in session. There was a brief pause on Monday January 3, just to take a look at mitigation procedures and see if there were any changes that needed to be made. Superintendent Buscemi asked if anyone had any questions and there were none.

# Village Trustee Liaison Report

Trustee Anderson expressed her appreciation for everyone bringing their heart and soul to the Parks and Recreation Department. She also wants to make sure that there is clear communication between the Village and staff, as well as the Board members. She said we need to work together to have one clear vision. She also thinks everyone is doing a great job and to just keep working together as one village.

# INFORMATIONAL MEMORANDUM


#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Last month, staff shared raw results of the resident survey related to pending changes at Lynn Dillow Park with the Parks and Recreation Board (Board). The intent was to provide the Board with the data available at that time, bringing a more comprehensive report before the Board at the February meeting. The following is a representation of that data and a request for Board direction as it relates to the upcoming Request for Simplified Proposals (RFSP).

Staff opened the survey up to respondents on December 10, 2021 advertising its availability through several postings on various social media sites, mention in the Resident Insider, and notice on the Village webpage. The survey remained active for 25 days and garnered one-hundred twenty-seven responses. Questions and a summary of those responses are as follows:

### 1. Number of Users per Age Group


Of the ninety-one responses to this question, the majority of users (50) are in the five to 12-year-old range with one or two individuals from a given household visiting the park. The next largest group (43) is those between the ages of thirty to forty-nine years old followed closely by those who are under five years old (26). Logic would suggest that those in the second group are largely there to accompany those in the youngest age bracket.

### 2. Frequency of Visits to the Park


The good news derived from this question is that of the eighty-eight respondents, Lynn Dillow Park is very popular with 67% visiting at least once a month. Of that number, 32% of respondents visit the park at least once per week.

### 3. How Do Users get to Lynn Dillow Park

Accessibility is a key factor to consider with any given park site. Nestled squarely within a residential neighborhood, seventy-two percent, or 61 of the 86 respondents indicate they walk to Lynn Dillow Park. Those that drive to the park total twenty-one percent or the next eighteen respondents. A small percentage, nearly six percent and two percent respectively either ride a bicycle or use another means to get to Lynn Dillow. This seems to indicate that the majority of users are from the surrounding neighborhood and that parking is adequate.




### 4. Why is it that You May not Use Lynn Dillow Park

Out of 23 responses, four indicated their children were too old to use the park and another four indicated that weather was a barrier for use. Six responses indicated the question was not applicable. The response regarding the age of the children is of particular interest, as it may suggest the Village explore adding a feature that might draw in older children.

# 5. Do Members of Your Household Require Special Accommodations to use Lynn Dillow Park

Inclusivity is an important issue to consider when designing a new park or selecting elements of replacement features. One purpose of this survey question was to determine how much of the available resources the Village should appropriate to this aspect of design or if scaling back this element in favor of installation or enhancement of inclusive features in another park was appropriate. While one survey cannot indicate the likelihood of this need at Lynn Dillow in the future, nor should the results of this question determine that accessible accommodations to some degree are not warranted, the responses at this time indicate that the need is proportionally small.

### 6. What Amenities are Required for you to Enjoy this Park More

A prime focus of any park is the type and quality of amenities available to users. As interest, construction methods, and design of various features evolves, users tend to gravitate to those items they find most interesting. The results of this survey indicate in interest in the following features as ranked from most to least popular and deemed as necessary for respondents to consider Lynn Dillow an enjoyable park site. Those amenities are:

- Swings suitable for various age groups (18)
- Sitting area/benches/shelters (16)
- Obstacle courses and climbing apparatus (14)
- Splash pad (11)
- Zipline (7)
- Basketball court (6)
- Bathrooms (5)
- Keeping the Frog element/volleyball/water fountain (2 for each item)


An important note to consider is that current design guidelines as recommended by the Board do not include swings or other elements for users under five years of age. A concern over this guideline came to light in this survey and through some feedback received after the reconstruction of the Ford School playground. The Board may wish to revisit this issue. Also, pending guidelines from the Department of Health make inclusion of a splash pad more costly.

### 7. Your Interest in Serving on a Focus Group for Lynn Dillow Park

Gaining user feedback, although a necessary component of the process is just one of many avenues a community can take to garner input and strive to meet the needs of all its constituents. As such, the survey sought to identify those interested in serving the process further by participating a focus group. The thirty-six responses were almost evenly split down the middle with nineteen responding in the affirmative and sixteen declining. Of the nineteen positive responses, seventeen provided contact information. Staff is in the process of contacting each of these to determine whether they will participate in discussions moving forward.

### 8. Ranking of Playground Features in order of Importance

Successful parks are those that incorporate the greatest number of popular features into a space and the best survey results often come from asking similar questions in different ways. Similar to item six which sought to better understand what elements would make users enjoy Lynn Dillow Park more, survey question ten asked respondents to rank playground features from most to least important. Those results showed a strong inclination to elements like swing, slides, climbing features, and zip lines. Elements such as track slides, tandem swings, monkey bars, and bridges make up the next popular group. Sensory panels, inclusive elements, tunnels and spinning features round out the least popular. The associated data table showing the weighted averages follows the bar graph for additional analysis.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Program Statistic Report gives an overview of programs and events that ran during all four quarters, along with a year to date total. Included with the program's revenue, expenses and net revenue, is the program's margin (percentage of revenue exceeding expenses) and the program's cost recovery (percentage of expenses covered by the revenue). This report also includes participation numbers for the programs and events.

The fourth quarter (October, November, December) included fall programs and December holiday programs.

Fall programming included Beyond the Bell Afterschool Care and Preschool Academy. The Beyond the Bell program was not offered in 2020 due to the pandemic. Participation numbers are not quite as strong as pre-pandemic as the need has changed for families. Preschool Academy was back in-person starting this fall. Four class rooms are being used Monday thru Friday. Staff hosted over a dozen new events during the fall and utilized over a dozen different locations throughout the Village.

At the end of the fourth quarter, overall recreation programs are running at a 157% cost recovery rate and have engaged 4799 people. Senior programming, youth programing, Preschool Academy, and Early Childhood programing areas performed under budget. Youth sports, special events, camp, and Beyond the Bell performed above budget. The Recreation Division's overall budget cost recovery ended at 36%. The Division's cost recovery was budgeted at 38%.

# Submitted by Recreation Superintendent, Kim Buscemi:

In November of 2021, The Village Board adopted Strategic Plan Goals and Objectives. The information below is intended to provide the Board with an update on what the staff is working on to achieve the goal, "Provide a wide array of outstanding parks and recreation programs to enhance quality of life for Village residents."

This goal has three objectives, which are listed below, along with updates on their initiatives:

- 1. Review prior year's successful programs and research current industry trends in recreation programs to effectively use existing and planned infrastructure and improve the demand for our programming
  - a. Quarterly review the ability to Increase community engagement and participation through programs and events while effectively using existing infrastructure
    - Staff continuously reviews and analyzes events and programs. With limited indoor space for programming, staff has expanded outdoor event offerings.
    - New for winter:
      - LMK Day events: LITH Ice Bowl Disc Golf Tournament, New Frozen Footgolf, Come Read with Us! Over 40 people enjoyed the outdoors.
      - Winter Weekend at Woodscreek Lake: Pond Hockey Tournament, Come Read with Us, New Youth Hockey, Ice Fishing Derby, new Chili cook-off and Cookie bake-off.
      - New Winter Wiffleball
      - New Teen Skate park trip
    - Senior programming is currently being reviewed and will incorporate some changes this spring.
  - b. Develop and implement a new strategy of value based recreational programming that meets participants' personal and social values by April 2022
    - Recreation staff determined a list of attributes that contribute to personal and social values which will be considered when developing programs and events. These attributes are physical wellbeing, mental wellbeing, stretching skills, socialization, reducing screen time, safety, inclusivity, enriching relationships, nature, culture, and uniquely LITH.
    - Programs and events will contain at least four of these attributes.
    - Marketing material for programs and events is incorporating messages pertaining how
      the program or event is contributing to the different attributes that contribute to a
      person's personal and social value.
    - Event surveys include asking what attributes were achieved from the event.
  - c. Evaluate where target audiences are spending their recreation time and/or money by October 2022
    - Program and event statistics are analyzed each quarter. Statistics include participation numbers, net revenue, margins, cost recovery, and overall satisfaction.
    - Program statistic are shared with the Park and Recreation Board four times a year.
  - d. Identify whether there are barriers to program registrations and utilize technology to assist in streamlining the process by May 2022
    - Staff has recognized the inefficiency of checking in participants at ticketed events. A
      barcode scanner has been purchased and will enable staff to check-in participants more
      efficiently.
- 2. Update and improve parks infrastructure to make the facilities more comprehensive and attract more regional users
  - a. Annually review and identify parks and facilities capable of administering a quality experience for youth, teens, or adults and develop a seasonal program plan rotation and implementation
    - Each season, prior to activity guide development, staff meets and plans program and event sites to use.
    - During the winter, events were planned at Linda K. Fischer park, Sunset park, Village Hall outside grounds, Indian Trail Beach, LaBahn Hain House, Larsen park, Village Hall indoor space, and Ken Carpenter park.
  - b. Revise Parks Master Plan to identify shortfalls and improve recreational facilities by December 2022

- A Request for Proposal (RFP) for the Parks Master Plan is in the process of being developed. Staff plans to issue the RFP in March, with selection to be made before midyear.
- 3. Create new partnerships with other parks and recreation organizations to improve the efficiency, effectiveness, and breadth of our programming
  - a. Annually identify new opportunities to co-op with other recreation organizations to maximize the Village's return for a variety of events
    - Recreation staff has planned events with the Algonquin Public Library, including Storytime and use of the library's Makermark room.
    - The Girls Scouts are donating bingo prizes and will be volunteering at the Daddy Daughter Date night.
    - Oasis, The Oaks of Algonquin and Kindred Hospice are donating bingo prizes and will be guest bingo callers.
  - b. Semi-annually review the partnership with NISRA by consulting on major community event plans to ensure inclusion opportunities for all populations
    - Staff met with NISRA in December. A NISRA family timeslot was added to the Daddy Daughter event.

### Submitted by Recreation Supervisor, Kristi Brewer:

**Beyond the Bell Afterschool Program at Lincoln Prairie:** Current regular attendance registration averages 35 students per week.

**Lake in the Hills Ice Bowl**® **Disc Golf Tournament:** On Monday, January 17, the first Ice Bowl® event was held at Linda K. Fischer Park – Disc Golf Course. Thirteen players braved the 26°F temperature, about ½ inch of snow on the course, an average 15 mph wind speed with flurry gusts up to 25 mph at times. Food donations were required in addition to the program fee, and Mulligan shots are available with an additional donation of five non-perishable items per shot.

Experienced and beginner player categories were offered, and the event included an after-tee-time fire pit party, awards for overall lowest score, closet to the pin/basket, and the "Ring of Fire" contest. Ring-of-fire does not involve flames but is a putting game where participants circle a basket and putt simultaneously. Those who make it retrieve their disc and continue putting until there is one winner. Awards were spread out to mitigate top winners from taking all. 173 lbs. of donations were divided between Grafton Township Food Pantry, School District 300 Food Pantry, and Algonquin/Lake in the Hills Interfaith Food Pantry.

Thank you to our event sponsor, DG Disc Store (Crystal Lake), for providing awards which included two limited-edition discs (First Place) and a portable all-metal disc golf basket (Ring-of-Fire). This event was a part of a series of worldwide disc golf events held during the winter months with an overall mission of collecting donations to fight hunger and food insecurity no matter the weather conditions. The event also emphasizes fun over the competition while promoting a positive image for disc golfers.



**Frozen Footgolf at Sunset Park:** Sunset Park was transformed into a 9-hole footgolf course on Monday, January 17, as an alternative use of the park in the off-season and to provide a free no-school-day

activity. The objective of footgolf – like traditional golf – is to advance the ball from the tee into the 'cup' in the fewest number of kicks (or strokes to use the traditional term). Each foot golfer is responsible for counting their kicks. After all players in a group have completed a hole, each foot golfers' "score" (or the number of kicks plus any applicable penalties) was recorded on the provided scorecard. Soccer balls were made available for use, and hot beverages were also served.

**Early Childhood programming:** Youth sports early winter session started on January 14<sup>th</sup>. Hot Shots Sports is offering Ninja Warrior classes on Friday evenings and soccer classes on Saturday mornings. The next session of youth sports starts up again the week of February 25<sup>th</sup>.

Rock'n'Kids early winter session started on January 11<sup>th</sup>. Tot Rock and Kid Rock classes are offered on Tuesday mornings and Wednesday evenings. The next session starts up February 22<sup>nd</sup>.

*Come Read with Us!* The recreation staff hosted *The Snowy Day* story display on January 17 at Sunset Park with activities to go along with the book.





**Preschool Academy:** Preschool currently has 61 students enrolled. The 2022-2023 school year enrollment opens February 21<sup>st</sup> for returning families, February 28th for residents, and March 7<sup>th</sup> for non-residents.
