The Lake in the Hills Police Department is participating in the National Prescription Drug Take Back Day Event on Saturday, October 29th

Lake in the Hills, IL - On Saturday, October 29th, 2022 from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m., the Lake in the Hills Police Department and the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will provide an opportunity for the community to safely rid their homes of potentially dangerous, expired, unused and unwanted prescription drugs. The collection location will be in the lower lobby of the Lake in the Hills Police Department, located at 1115 Crystal Lake Road. Prior to drop off, the police department requests the removal all prescription labels or to black out labels with a marker. The service is free and anonymous; no questions will asked of the individuals dropping off the prescription medication.

Tablets, capsules, patches and other solid forms of prescription drugs can be collected the day of the event. Liquids (including intravenous solutions), syringes/other sharps and illegal drugs will not be accepted. Vaping devices and cartridges will be accepted, provided lithium batteries are removed prior to drop off.

The DEA explains unneeded prescription medication, those that are old, unwanted, or no longer needed, are a public safety issue and too often unneeded prescription medication becomes a gateway to addiction. The DEA states the majority of opioid addictions start with prescription pills found in medicine cabinets at home. Pharmaceutical drugs can be just as dangerous as street drugs when taken without a prescription or a doctor's supervision, the DEA advises. With studies indicating a majority of abused prescription drugs come from family and friends, including from home medicine cabinets, clearing out unused medicine is essential. The DEA's National Prescription Drug Take Back Day events are one way to safety dispose of unneeded medications.
