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Lake in the Hills Police Department announces Memorial Day *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* traffic enforcement campaign results

Lake in the Hills, IL - From May 14th through June 1st, the Lake in the Hills Police Department joined forces with state and local police agencies as part of the Memorial Day enforcement campaign in an effort to make travel safer. During this time, 35 hours of additional patrols were conducted through a grant obtained from the Illinois Department of Transportation's Sustained Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP).

Throughout the mobilization, officers performed 39 traffic stops for various violations including:

- 20 seat belt citations
- 14 speeding citations
- Six uninsured motorists
- Three citations for operating motor vehicle while using electronic communications device
- One citation issued for disregarding a traffic control signal

Additionally, four arrests were made with charges outlined below:

- Driving While License Suspended, Speeding 35+ Over (105 in a 50mph zone), No Insurance
- Driving While License Revoked, Operating Motor Vehicle While Using Electronic Communications
 Device
- Driving While License Revoked, Driver Required to Wear Seatbelt, No Insurance
- Speeding 35+ Over (90 in a 50mph zone)
