Parks Master Plan:

Hitchcock Design Group has submitted the draft of the parks master plan for the Parks and Recreation Board's review. All feedback should be directed to staff for any adjustments to the plan by the end of June. HDG will present the draft to the Village Board, June 11. Final adoption for the Parks Master Plan is anticipated in July/August 2024.

Public Works Open House:

Parks and Recreation staff participated at the annual Public Works open house on Saturday, May 18. The event provided staff a great opportunity to engage with the public and our local sports affiliates on upcoming parks and recreation summer programs and events. Staff was very pleased with the turnout and the opportunity to be a part of the event.

Playgrounds:

NuToys Leisure Product, Inc and staff visited Celebration Park and Jaycee Park on Monday, May 12 as a follow up from the May 2, Parks and Recreation Board meeting. Staff reviewed the recommend features desired at both Celebration and Jaycee Park with NuToys and reviewed current footprint of the existing playground layouts to ensure all design concepts would work. NuToys will be present at the June 6 Parks and Recreation meeting with updated Concept Plans for recommendation.

Staff also visited the 2025 playground locations scheduled for replacement. Avalon Park and Nature's View Park. The idea is to start the planning process late this summer to assist with budget and scheduling for 2025.

Public Properties Update:

Plote field netting project starts June 4. Staff is working with user groups to ensure smooth transition for all activities. Nockel's Park Pier replacement will be starting the week of June 3. 2 Piers will be installed. Fishing pier will be adjusted closer to the Hain house for. Boat Pier will be installed in same location.

A Request for Board Action is going before the Village Board for Baxter and Woodman for them to be the general contractor for the Barbara Key dredging project, which will transform the front pond area into a fishing and recreational destination for residents. The Village Board approved and allocated funds in the FY24 budget of \$472,000.00.
