As the sole female officer in her new hire class at the Illinois State Police academy in 1994, Chief Frake was bound to stand out from the very start of her career. Chief Frake quickly distinguished herself as a talented and gifted officer.

Chief Frake spent several years on patrol and then in investigations as a detective where she advocated for victims of crime and worked to ensure their voices were heard and respected. Under her leadership, the police department saw a period of transformation and growth. She prioritized staffing and wellness, recognizing that a well-supported force is essential to effective law enforcement.
