



# **Food Scrap Composting Program**

The Village of Lake in the Hills and Flood Bros Disposal Co. have partnered with the goal of



decreasing the amount of organic refuse sent to landfills. Together we are offering a voluntary food scrap composting program to residents throughout the Village. Residents who enroll in this program will have the ability to mix food scraps with yard waste by placing food scraps at the curb in a rigid and lidded container — with a capacity not exceeding 33-gallons, or in a rented Flood Brothers 95-gallon yard waste cart (arranged directly

through Flood Brothers for an extra \$2.25/month).

Who Can Participate: The program is available to all single-family residences at no additional cost (unless you choose to rent a Flood Brothers yard waste cart). The program will coincide with the yard waste seasonal collection program (April 1<sup>st</sup> – November 30<sup>th</sup>) and curbside collection will occur on a weekly basis on your normal scheduled collection day. We ask that you please return the signup form below to register for the program. Please be sure to include your email address for monthly program updates, education seminars and event information.

**How to Participate:** We require all residents to be signed up in the program prior to participating. ## **Compost: Questions & Answers**

### What is Composting?

Composting occurs when organic materials decompose. Under this program, your yard waste and food scraps are taken to a compost facility where they are processed into compost and mulches. The compost and mulches are then used to fertilize soils and protect soils from erosion.

Additionally, since yard waste and food scraps are high emitters of methane, a gas more potent than carbon dioxide, composting these materials (as opposed to placing these materials in landfills) reduces air pollution and greenhouse gas emissions.

#### **Composting Facts**

- Globally, 4 Billion Tons of food is wasted per year.
- 40% of food in the United States goes uneaten every year, estimated 35 million tons.
- 20 pounds of food waste per person per month is wasted.

### **Food Scrap Cart Care Tips**

You may want to place yard trimmings, newspaper or pizza box at the bottom and layer your food scraps with yard trimmings inside the cart. Also, food scraps can be wrapped in paper towels, old newspapers or paper bags for a cleaner cart and you can rinse your cart with a garden hose when necessary and/or sprinkle in baking soda as needed.
