VILLAGE OF LAKE IN THE HILLS PARKS & RECREATION BOARD MEETING

March 5th, 2020

The Parks & Recreation Board meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. at the Lake in the Hills Village Hall Board Room. Those present were Members Wackerlin, Cairns, Sivakumar, Andrea, Anderson, Sandage and Chairwoman Tredore. Also present were Director of Community Services Fred Mullard, Director of Public Works Dan Kaup, Management Analyst Peter D'Agostino, Superintendent of Public Properties Scott Parchutz, Recreation Supervisor Kristi Brewer and Customer Service Specialist Megan Schnaebele.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEM

None

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion to approve the minutes of the Parks & Recreation Board meeting of February 6th, 2020 was made by Member Anderson and seconded by Member Andrea. The motion was approved by a voice vote of 7-0.

OLD BUSINESS

None

NEW BUSINESS

Management Analyst Peter D'Agostino opened the discussion with a brief explanation of the replacements and public surveys completed regarding replacement options. Analyst D'Agostino requested members provide Village staff with their top three concepts for each replacement. D'Agostino continued stating that Village staff will obtain bids for the top three concepts of each playground and will resume discussion at the April 2nd, 2020 Parks & Recreation Board meeting. D'Agostino indicated that at the April 2nd, 2020 meeting Members will be asked to narrow down their selection to one concept per playground replacement and these choices will then be presented to the Board of Trustees at the April 21st, 2020 Committee of the Whole meeting.

- A. Selection of Contractors to Bid for Horner Park Playground Replacement: Chairwoman Tredore opened the discussion by asking the audience if there was any feedback or recommendations for the Horner Park Playground Replacement. There were no comments. Voting commenced among the Members. Member Sandage voted for concept numbers three, six and eight. Member Anderson voted for concept numbers six, seven and eight. Member Andrea voted for concept numbers three, five and eight. Chairwoman Tredore voted for concept numbers six, seven and eight. Member Sivakumar voted for concept numbers five, six and seven. Member Cairns voted for concept numbers three, seven and eight. Member Wackerlin voted for concept numbers three, eight and four. Member Sivakumar inquired if one of the four swings offered in concept number three could be exchanged for a wheelchair or ADA compatible swing. Superintendent of Public Properties advised that all concepts are ADA approved and that the change is possible. Member Sandage inquired if colors could be included in the April RFP for final selection. Management Analyst D'Agostino indicated that it will be included in the final RFP for April's meeting. Member Anderson informed staff that the desired handicap access includes ramps so children are able to access and play on the equipment with other children. Management Analyst D'Agostino acknowledged the request. Final votes for Horner Park were concept numbers three, six and eight.
- **B. Selection of Contractors to Bid for Echo Park Playground Replacement:** Chairwoman Tredore opened the discussion by asking the audience if there was any feedback or recommendations for the

Echo Park Playground Replacement. Lake in the Hills Resident, Allie Kreuz, advised that her top selections for Echo Park are concept numbers one, two and eight. Kreuz also indicated that a mom and tot swing would be a nice feature if possible. Chairwoman Tredore inquired on the resident's opinion of Ken Carpenter Park. Kreuz indicated that she was aware of and understands the reason behind the design but dislikes the changes to the park. Voting commenced among the Members. Member Sandage voted for concept numbers one, three and eight. Member Anderson voted for concept numbers six, eight and nine. Member Andrea voted for concept numbers five, six and eight. Chairwomen Tredore voted for concept numbers three, six and eight. Member Sivakumar voted for concept numbers five, six and eight. Member Cairns voted for concept numbers two, three and eight. Member Wakerlin voted for concept numbers eight, three and one. Member Wakerlin asked resident Kreuz what she felt was interesting about concepts number one and two. Kreuz stated that the most interesting feature was the height and that the equipment offered multiple levels which is favorited by the children. Kreuz was concerned about the lack of height offered with concept numberthree, but did like the zip line feature. Member Wakerlin indicated that concept numbers three, six and eight are all similar in height and encouraged Members to seek a taller option for residents as well. Member Sivakumar indicated she likes concept number eight due to the round chair that the equipment offers. Member Anderson indicated that concept number eight was favored by the children as it offered the most climbing features. Discussion commenced among the members. Final votes for Echo Park were concept numbers one, three and eight.

- C. Selection of Contractors to Bid for Edward Hynes Park Playground Replacement: Chairwoman Tredore opened the discussion by asking the audience if there was any feedback or recommendations for the Edward Hynes Playground Replacement. Resident Allie Kreuz inquired on if the surface of the playgrounds was to be discussed. Superintendent Parchutz indicated that mulch will continue to be utilized as the surface of the playgrounds. Voting commenced among the Members. Member Sandage voted for concept numbers three, six and seven. Member Anderson voted for concept numbers six, seven and eight. Member Andrea voted for concept numbers one, seven and eight. Chairwoman Tredore voted for three, six and seven. Member Sivakumar voted for concept numbers four, eight and nine. Member Cairns voted for concept numbers six, seven and eight. Member Wackerlin voted for concept numbers seven, two and eight. Discussion commenced among the Members. Final votes for Edward Hynes Park were concept numbers six, seven and eight.
- **D.** Selection of Contractors to Bid for Richard Taylor Park Skate Park Replacement: Management Analyst D'Agostino indicated that all three concepts for the Skate Park replacement will be advancing. No vote was conducted.

STAFF REPORTS

- **A. Recreation Staff Report:** Recreation Supervisor Kristi Brewer provided an overview on the upcoming dates of interest. Brewer reported that all core programs are now running through Community Pass and facilities are soon to follow. Brewer provided an update on the Preschool Academy and reported that registration is on track and still being accepted. Brewer indicated that the Daddy Daughter Date Day and Night events were a success with 226 participants. Brewer gave a brief overview of FuntastiCamp and indicated that she is targeting April for the start of registration.
- **B. Parks Staff Report:** Superintendent of Public Properties Scott Parchutz provided an overview of a few upcoming projects. Superintendent Parchutz indicated that the bid openings thus far have had a good response and that the bid for the roof replacements at Indian Trail Beach has already been awarded. Member Andrea inquired on if the parks lightening protection warning system will be sent to a third world country for further use or how it will be disposed of. Superintendent Parchutz indicated that the system will be recycled like similar out of date electronics.

TRUSTEE LIAISON REPORT

Trustee Murphy was not in attendance.

MEMBER COMMENTS

Member Wakerlin thanked the residents that attended the meeting for their time and input regarding the playground replacements. Chairwoman Tredore also thanked the audience for their time and participation stating that it is greatly appreciated. Member Andrea thanked the residents for attending as well and the vendors for providing colorful plaques and brochures for reference. Member Anderson thanked the residents for attending and also thanked staff for their hard work in the replacement project. Member Sandage inquired on if an additional survey reflecting the top three concepts for each replacement could be made available for resident input. Member Sandage added that some parks also contain information on the history of the park and stated that it is a very nice feature.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Resident Allie Kreuz added that she felt it would be incredibly beneficial for residents to see and be able to provide feedback on the final three design concepts for each park. Kreuz thanked the Members and staff for including residents in the selection process.

ADJOURNMENT

Member Andrea made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Member Sivakumar seconded the motion. The motion was approved by a voice vote of 7-0. The meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m.

SUBJECT: 2020 Playground and Skate Park Replacements

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This year, the Village plans to replace the existing skate park equipment at Richard Taylor Park and the existing playground equipment at Horner Park, Echo Park, and Edward Hynes Park.

Request For Simplified Proposals

In January, Village staff released a Request For Simplified Proposals requesting replacement design concept plans and through this process, Village staff received design concept plans for each location. Village staff then released a survey in February requesting resident feedback on the initial design concept plans. After reviewing the February survey results, one desired feature that was repeatedly mentioned in the survey was a zip-line. As such, Village staff contacted the playground vendors at the end of February, provided them with a copy of the survey results and gave them the option of adding one or more additional design concept plans. The playground vendors responded by providing Village staff with eight additional design concept plans, for a total of 29 design concept plans.

March 5th Focus Group and Parks and Recreation Board Meeting

In February, Village staff released a press release inviting residents to a March 5th Focus Group Meeting at Village Hall. At the Focus Group meeting, each design concept plan was on display and the public was given an opportunity to comment on each design. Immediately following the Focus Group meeting, the Parks and Recreation Board met and used the public input to select three "final" design concepts for each location. Following the March 5th Parks and Recreation Board Meeting, the vendors that submitted the three "final" design concepts for each location were asked to participate in a Request For Proposal (RFP) process that requested pricing and a final design proposal.

Request For Proposal (RFP)

On March 9th, the vendors that submitted the three "final" design concepts for each location were invited to participate in a competitive bid process. The RFP opening occurred on March 18th and the RFP bid tabulation is attached as Attachment 1. Although two skate park design vendors were selected as "finalists" for the replacement of the Richard Taylor Skate Park, one vendor decided not to continue to participate in this process and cited the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act requirement and the costs they would need to bear to travel to Illinois from California as reasons why they decided to not participate in the RFP. It should be noted that Village staff contacted all known skate park vendors in January, encouraged them to participate in this process, but many of the skate park vendors were not willing to participate and cited the distance between their operation and Illinois as a common reason.

The RFP submittals are attached as Attachment 2. The design concept plans that were acquired through the RFP process were uploaded to a survey for Village residents and the survey results will be shared with the Parks and Recreation Board members prior to April 2nd.

Next Steps

After reviewing all RFP bid submittals and considering resident feedback obtained through the most recent Village resident survey, Village staff request that the Parks and Recreation Board select one design concept plan for each location for Village staff to recommend to the Village Board of Trustees at the April 9th Village Board Meeting.

A. Reservations

Certain Village facilities may be utilized for public or private assembly on terms and conditions set forth in this policy. Approval for facility use will require that the event or activity meet the following standards:

- That the primary purpose of any gathering provides for an activity or program that would be in the best interest of the community and provides a positive benefit.
- That the activity or event does not discriminate, degrade or portray disrespect toward any individual or organization and/or creates a negative impact to the community.
- That the soliciting or collection of money for the purpose of sales, promotion or negotiating for sales within said facilities is prohibited without prior authorization from the Director of Parks and Recreation-Public Works, Public Works designee or Recreation Department designee.
- Requested time of facility use will be considered and approved by the Village's Director of Parks and Recreation, or designee Public Works, Public Works designee or Recreation Department designee.

Those interested in reserving a Village Facility are required to complete the Village of Lake in the Hills Facility Use Permit Form or agree to the policies via the online facility reservation. The Facility Use Permit Form must be submitted to the Parks Director of Public Works, Public Works designee or Recreation Department designee Recreation Department along with all applicable security deposits, fees, and/or insurance documentation in order for approval to be considered.

- LaBahn-Hain House Year Round Village Hall Rooms Year Round (Except holidays)
 - o Community Room
 - o Multi-Purpose Room (Lower Level) Athletic Fields Year Round
- Picnic Shelters Reservations accepted on from the first Monday in February to September 30 of for the current calendar year (Available from May 1 to September 30)

B. **Definitions**

- 1. Village of Lake in the Hills any facility or field use for Village events, meetings, programs, and /or contracted programs (to include Lake in the Hills Affiliate Organizations).
- 2. Residents: Any person residing in the Village of Lake in the Hills.

- 3. Non-residents: Any person or group residing outside the village limits of Lake in the Hills.
- 4. Civic Groups: Not-for-profit groups benefitting the community based on discretion of Director of Parks and Recreation-Public Works, Public Works designee or Recreation Department designee.

C. Scheduling

Village facilities are available for use by the general public on a first come, first serve basis. All facility reservations will require at least seven days notice prior to the rental date and no more than a six months advance notice facilities are reserved in real-time and can be reserved up to one year in advance. If staff is able to accommodate a reservation with less than a seven day notice, a \$50 fee will be applied.

Facilities

Scheduling for all facilities are subject to the discretion of the Director of Parks & Recreation, or designee Public Works, Public Works designee or Recreation Department designee. Priority in scheduling shall be as follows:

- 1. Village of Lake in the Hills
- 2. Residents / Non-residents
- 3. Affiliate Groups / Community Civic Groups (limit 2 times per month)

Scheduling for all athletic fields are subject to the discretion of the Director of Parks & Recreation, or designee Public Works, Public Works designee or Recreation Department designee. Priority in scheduling shall be as follows:

- 1. Village of Lake in the Hills (including Affiliate groups)
- 2. Residents
- 3. Non-Residents

Plote Field

- 1. Village related use
- 2. YAA
- 3. NIMBL
- 4. American Legion
- 5. Residents
- 6. Non-residents

D. Eligibility

Residents/Non-residents making a reservation for a Lake in the Hills facility must be at least 21 years of age and be present at the activity or event.

E. Maintenance

- Facilities are to be left in an acceptable, clean, and orderly condition. The facility user bears the responsibility of removing all personal items and materials from the facility.
- All accumulated trash in bathrooms, kitchen, rental room(s), outside shelters, and perimeter park areas is to be disposed of in available trash receptacles or dumpster.
- •Tables and chairs are to be properly cleaned, stacked, and stowed at the conclusion of the gathering. Picnic tables must be returned within the shelter.
- Removal of Village property from a facility is absolutely prohibited and will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.
- Prior to exiting a facility, ensure that all interior lights are turned off and check ALL exit doors to ensure that they are locked.
- Renters must comply with all regulations and ordinances of the Village of Lake in the Hills including the Noise Ordinance, the park, or facility use hours, etc.

F. Rules & Regulations

- The Village has the authority to deny or restrict use of a requested facility for any reason.
- Smoking tobacco and the use of smokeless tobacco products is prohibited in all public facilities or within 15 feet of any entrance to a public place, sports field, athletic court, skate park, recreational shelter or structure, public beach, disc golf course, splash pad, and dog park in the Village.
- No alcoholic beverages are allowed in Village facilities or on any park grounds. Exception: the Liquor Commissioner may grant a daily/event permit, which is processed by the Administration Department for an additional fee. Applicants who are not acting on behalf of an organization or club may request that the Village accept a general liability policy covering the event in lieu of the insurance required under Chapter 33. The Village may accept such alternative coverage where the policy includes social host liquor liability insurance and names the Village as an additional insured for the duration of the event for which the Facility and Park Use Permit and daily or event permit has been requested. The policy shall maintain limits no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. (Note: this is a separate policy, not part of a homeowner's insurance policy.) The cost for this policy would be in addition to the cost of the daily/event permit.
- Facility phones are to be used for emergencies only.
- Any unusual incidents (i.e. property damage, injury to user, conflict/argument between users, etc.) should be immediately reported to the Parks & Recreation Department Director of Public Works, Public Works designee or Recreation Department designee or the Police Department.
- Facility Use Permit will be issued upon approval of request receipt of an online payment.

- A copy of the approved reservation payment receipt must be on site during your rental.
- Pets are prohibited in Village indoor facilities (exception: Service dogs or other approved service animals)
- The Village of Lake in the Hills will not be liable for any claims for injury, illness or damages resulting from or arising out of the use of the Village's facilities or premise adjacent thereto. The renter agrees to indemnify the Village and hold it harmless against any and all such claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including incidents arising out of the consumption, preparation or disposal of food at the facility. If requested by the Village, the renter shall carry insurance against such claims and furnish the Village with a certificate of insurance evidencing same.

G. Village Indoor Facilities

(Village Hall Community and Multi-Purpose Rooms, and LaBahn Hain House):

- All indoor facility rentals require a two-hour minimum pre-determined block rental.

 This does not Block rental time parameters include the set-up and clean-up time so events should begin and end accordingly.
- A minimum of seven days notice is required for Village Hall facility rentals are made in real-time and can be made same day if a facility is available.
- The facilities may not be utilized past 11pm at Village Hall and midnight at the LaBahn Hain House 11:30pm. Village of Lake in the Hills Police Department confirms facilities are cleared and secure while on patrolling the respective areas.
- Up to 30 minutes prior to the agreed rental start time will be authorized for facility set up.
- Up to 30 minutes beyond agreed rental end time will be authorized for facility clean up.

H. Village Outdoor Facilities

• Picnic Shelters

- o Parks are open from sunrise to sunset.
- Shelter reservation is only for exclusive use of the shelter, and not the adjacent grounds.
- o Fishing in any lake or pond is authorized with the possession of a valid state fishing license. Fish caught must be returned to the pond/lake.
- Vehicles are not allowed on the bike paths to load and unload items for a shelter rental.
- Charcoal used for grills must be extinguished prior to the party leaving the premise.
- If inclement weather on day of rental, payment can be transferred to a new date or refunded.

• Athletic Fields

Athletic fields are designated as the following: Baseball, Softball, Football, Soccer, Lacrosse, Cricket, Basketball, Volleyball, and Tennis

- o Games shall be completed by sunset or 10:30pm at lighted fields.
- o No hitting balls off of field fences.
- O Smoking tobacco and the use of smokeless tobacco products is prohibited in all public facilities or within 15 feet of any entrance to a public place, sports field, athletic court, skate park, recreational shelter or structure, public beach, disc golf course, splash pad, and dog park in the Village.
- Proper field maintenance and respect of the field/equipment is expected by all users.
- o In addition to the notice requirements under section E, any property damage incurred during any play must be reported by the responsible party to the property owner.
- o Alcohol is strictly prohibited anywhere on the grounds or park.
- Plote Field inquiries must contact the Parks & Recreation Department Public Works or Public Works designee.

I. Fees

Fees vary depending on the facility. Please refer to Exhibit A of this document for a complete list of fees by facility.

EXHIBIT A - FEES

Deposit:

No deposit is required for standard rentals. However, damage to facility or failure to follow cleaning guidelines and facility procedures will result in collection action.

A deposit fee of \$1,000 is required for major events. These are defined as events which require more than one acre of park site and anticipated attendance over 250 people. Examples include: carnival, circus, festival or a tournament.

Cancellation Fees:

- 14 days prior to the date of rental no refunds will be issued.
- 15 to 30 days prior to the date of rental a 25% rental fee refund would be issued.
- 31 to 60 days prior to the date of rental a 50% rental fee refund would be issued

• 61 days prior to the date of rental a full refund minus a \$5 service fee will be issued.

Tournament Fees:

Affiliate Organization tournament fees are spelled out in the Affiliate Agreement. Tournaments by outside organizations will be charged the appropriate hourly or game rate.
