Lake in the Hills, IL – Governor J.B. Pritzker has announced that he will sign a modified version of the state's stay at home order that will go into effect on May 1 until May 30, 2020. The Village of Lake in the Hills urges community members to continue to follow Governor Pritzker's order as public health agencies work to stem and slow the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic in the region. Additional information on the stay-at-home order's extension, including the new modifications, will be available at coronavirus.illinois.gov.

In response, the Village has extended its recent facility closures to the public and the suspension of all programs and events through Saturday, May 30, 2020. Per the Stay-at-Home Order, the Village's open spaces, paths, Bark Park, and trails will remain open; however, all Village playgrounds, basketball courts, tennis courts, volleyball courts, and skate parks will remain closed to the public. Village water shutoffs and late fees will remain suspended through June 1, 2020.

The Village's essential services remain available via telephone, email, and through the Village website, lith.org. Additionally, the Records Division in the upper lobby of the police station will continue reduced hours of operation from 8:30am to 5:00pm, Monday through Friday, until further notice. The lower level of the police station remains open 24/7. For more information on the facility closures and program cancellations, please visit lith.org/coronavirus.
